❖ Resident Disputes and Resolution Solutions

Sometimes, a minor dispute between neighbors may grow into a situation that is difficult and upsetting for all parties. While the Village tries to help in these situations, occasionally additional mediation assistance is necessary. The “Alternative Dispute Resolution Program” is a free service available through the Northwest Municipal Conference. Residents with a dispute may report it to the Village. The Village would then refer them to the Northwest Municipal Conference and a mediation session would be arranged. A mediator from the Center for Conflict Resolution in Chicago would listen to each side of the dispute and guide participants to a mutually satisfying resolution. ❖ Prescription Discount Cards

During these difficult economic times, I realize that some of you are faced with either no health insurance coverage or the burden of having to pay additional out of pocket expenses for prescription drugs which may not be covered under your existing prescription plan. To help ease some of the financial burden, I would like our residents to be aware of the Prescription Discount Card Programs being offered throughout the country. These cards are free and may help you save up to an average of 22% off of the full retail cost of prescription medication. The majority of pharmacy chains and most local independent pharmacies accept them. These cards are not meant to be used in place of your existing prescription card, but rather to be used by individuals with either no existing health insurance, or for those whose current prescription benefit plan will not cover a prescription.

Although there are many programs available, we have listed here a few websites offering these cards. These programs are not endorsed by the Village of Northbrook and are just being provided to you as a reference. Make Sure Your Home is Winterized!

Cold weather brings with it the potential for frozen water service lines, water meters and residential fire sprinkler systems. Winterize your home by doing the following:

- Check thoroughly to identify and seal all cold air drafts near water pipes, including basement windows, crawl space vents and the glass water meter viewing block.
- Install fire retardant insulation around susceptible pipes.
- Install Underwriters Laboratories (UL) listed electric heater tape on pipes that are located on the inside of exterior walls, which may have only marginal insulation. North and west walls are typically most vulnerable.
- If you have an underground lawn sprinkling system, shut off the water supply and properly drain the system.
- Residential Fire Sprinkler Systems are vulnerable too! As a reminder, if you vacation during winter months, set the thermostat no lower than 55°F before leaving to prevent frozen pipes and sprinkler systems.

Northbrook Wildlife Survey

If you reside in an area within the Village of Northbrook that is inhabited by deer or have been impacted by deer in some way, please complete this survey.

The Village of Northbrook is adjacent to several Forest Preserve areas that provide a natural habitat for wildlife. Our well-developed office parks and residential subdivisions often include ponds, waterways, open areas and lush landscaping that encourage wildlife to settle. Some of our parks are planted as natural prairie restoration sites, also welcoming certain species of wildlife.

The Village of Northbrook has recognized that the ecological carrying capacities of the land must be considered in facilitating these areas and maintaining a balance for both our residents and our wildlife.

In 1991, the Village Board of Trustees passed a resolution urging the Illinois Department of Conservation (IDOC) to develop and coordinate a program which will keep the deer population of Cook County in ecological balance with the available food supply.

In 1995, in an effort to reduce damage and accidents while providing a healthy environment for all, the Village applied to IDOC for its first Deer Population Control Permit. The Village's concerns were based on numerous deer sightings within the Village limits (not including Forest Preserve property), property damage and motor vehicle vs. deer accidents. Many residents responded to the first Deer Survey included in the September 1995 **Northbrook!** Newsletter which provided supporting documentation for this program. Subsequent surveys have continued throughout the years to provide updated information and support for additional Deer Population Control Permits.

The Deer Population Control Program must be justified each year based on current statistics. There are some areas in the Village where we have made a positive impact on the ecological carrying capacity of the land, however, in order to continue to monitor deer activity and provide support in other areas of the Village, we are again asking for your input. Your response is CONFIDENTIAL, but please include your name, address and phone number so that we may properly locate specific areas of activity and can contact you if additional information is required. **Your assistance and prompt response in completing the survey is appreciated. Surveys are due by Monday, December 13, 2010.**



Public Works Is Ready!

When the winter weather hits Northbrook, our residents and businesses can rest assured that the streets will be cleared as our Public Works Department goes into full gear to clear snow from over 532 plow lane miles of roadway in Northbrook! Our snow removal operation begins with seven or more trucks spreading de-icing materials on main and secondary streets. As snow begins to accumulate, standby personnel are called in to plow all Village maintained streets, municipal parking lots and designated sidewalks. Please note: The Public Works Department **does not** clear private driveway entrances.

Please Be Patient

A complete plow cycle takes approximately 6-7 hours to complete, depending on weather and traffic conditions. Snow and ice control efforts give priority to arterial roadways such as Walters Avenue, Cherry Lane, and Shermer Road. The Village of Northbrook's number one concern is the safety of motorists and pedestrians using our streets.

Be Part of the Solution

You can help Public Works crews clear our roadways as quickly as possible by not parking cars on the street when snow removal operations are in progress.



Our Crews are Trained and Ready! A full scale plowing effort requires 30 or more trained and experienced crew members and up to 24 pieces of equipment to clear 532+ lane miles of roadway that includes 249 cul-de-sacs, dead-ends and several alleys.

Snowfall Parking Restrictions:

Your Cooperation is Appreciated During Snow Emergencies!

A snow emergency is declared when two or more inches of snow accumulates in a 24 hour period. After a snowfall of 2 or more inches, it is illegal to park on Northbrook streets until they have been cleared. If your vehicle is parked on the street, a reasonable effort will be made to contact you to move your vehicle. If this fails, your vehicle will be ticketed and towed. If your vehicle has become disabled, call 847 564-2060 to inform the police.
