Fire Chief Nolan to Retire November 16

Fire Chief Mark Nolan will retire on November 16.



This date is significant because it is thirty-three years to the day that he worked his first shift as a Northbrook Firefighter.

Nolan rose through the ranks and was promoted to Lieutenant in 1991, Captain in 1997, District Chief in 2002, Deputy Chief in 2003 and Fire Chief in 2007. During Nolan's tenure, he saw the expansion of the Fire Department from two stations to three and from 2,200 calls for service in 1981 to over 6,000 calls for service projected this year. Some of the Department's greatest achievements under Chief Nolan include the enhanced life safety initiatives through the adoption of automatic sprinkler systems for new construction, and installing automatic external defibrillators (AED) in all Village of Northbrook public buildings and in all fire and police vehicles.

The Northbrook Firefighters slogan, "Our family helping yours, by safely and diligently doing the right thing, at the right time, for the right reason," are heartfelt words Nolan shared often.

Chief Nolan's service, leadership and dedication will be missed.

A Message from Police Chief Charles Wernick

How You Can Avoid Crimes of Opportunity

A criminal often targets the easiest home to enter, the easiest car to break into, or the easiest purse to snatch.

Most criminals want easy targets, so making it tough for them will reduce your risk. There are things that you can do to prevent crime! It's not unusual for someone to call to report a missing purse, cell phone or electronic device. Often times these items are taken from an unlocked vehicle, sometimes parked in the caller's driveway or when left unattended for a quick stop, such as running into the daycare, going to the park or going to the health club.

If you must leave valuables in your car, place them in the trunk before you reach your destination.

Keep Your Belongings Close

It's easy for a thief to grab something from a purse when it's left unattended in a shopping cart, sitting on a counter or hanging on the back of a chair in a busy dining establishment or coffee shop. Prevention of a crime of opportunity may be as simple as paying attention to your surroundings and not leaving any valuables unattended, even just for a few minutes.

In Your Neighborhood

If you see suspicious vehicles driving slowly or repetitively around your neighborhood, report the vehicle and plate number. If you see someone at your neighbor's front door and then walking around the house call 911 with a description. Residents are reminded to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity by calling 911 immediately.

Making Face to Face Transactions

The Northbrook Police Station may be used as a location for exchanges which may involve safety concerns. During exchanges, such as *Craigslist* transactions or times when an exchange in a public setting is best, residents are allowed to use the lobby or the public parking lot located at the front of 1401 Landwehr Road.

There's No Business Like Snow Business

Our Northbrook Public Works Department has been preparing for this winter's snow removal operations.

The Village's snow removal operation begins with seven or more trucks spreading de-icing materials on main and secondary streets. As snow begins to accumulate, standby personnel are called in to plow the 537 lane miles of Village owned and maintained streets, municipal parking lots and designated sidewalks.

Help Our Crews

Keep Your Vehicles Off the Streets.

You can help Public Works crews clear our roadways as quickly as possible by keeping vehicles off the street during snow removal operations. The Village's number one concern is the safety of those using our streets.

Important Snow Plowing Facts...

A complete plow-cycle can take at least 6-7 hours depending on weather and traffic.

Snow and ice control efforts give priority to higher traffic Village roadways such as Walters Avenue, Cherry Lane, Pfingsten Road, Techny Road, and Shermer Road.

Arterial roads such as Lake-Cook, Dundee, Willow, Sanders, Landwehr and Waukegan are plowed by either the Illinois Department of Transportation or the Cook County Highway Department.

Keep Plowed Snow out of Shoveled Driveways.

Residents can help keep their driveway clear by shoveling snow to the right side of their driveway (as viewed from the home looking at the street). Please note: The Public Works Department does not clear private driveway entrances.



Move Your Vehicle After 2" of Snow

When 2 or more inches of snow fall, it is illegal (by Village Ordinance) to park on Northbrook streets until plowing has been completed. If you park in the street you may be ticketed and towed.

If your vehicle has become disabled or if you would like to find out if the parking ban is in effect, please call the Police Department at 847/564-2060.



Discounted Nuisance Animal Trapping Services

In response to complaints from Village residents regarding skunk activity within Northbrook, the Village has secured a preferred vendor.



Northwest Suburban Animal Control will perform discounted nuisance animal trapping services for skunks, raccoons, squirrels, opossums, and chipmunks to Northbrook single family homes.

The price for the initial inspection, setting of the trap, and daily monitoring Monday through Friday is \$95.00. Customers will be responsible for checking traps on Saturdays and Sundays and notifying Northwest Suburban Animal Control by 9:00am for same day pick up if an animal is trapped. The animal pick up/removal fee is \$45.00 per animal.

Northwest Suburban Animal Control has been serving the area suburbs for over 20 years. Their hours of operation are Monday through Friday, 8am to 5pm.

Residents will be billed directly by Northwest Suburban Animal Control for services rendered. To schedule nuisance wildlife trapping services with Northwest Suburban Animal Control, residents can call 847/934-1900 or send a text message to 847/502-3518.

Village residents are not required to utilize Northwest Suburban Animal Control's services and may still use any other Illinois Department of Natural Resources licensed wildlife trapping company of their choice.

Looking to Recycle?

Electronics Monthly Collection Update

Northbrook offers a drop off opportunity for household electronics on the first Tuesday of every month from 8am to 3pm. The drop-off area is located at the Village Fleet Maintenance Garage behind the Village Hall. The first Tuesday of the month collection includes both large and small e-waste such as computers, televisions and small appliances. Staff is available to assist with removing items from your vehicle.

Paint & Chemicals

Please note: The Village does not collect paint, oil or any other chemicals. Save these items to recycle at the April Earth and Arbor Day Collection or other special recycling events. Watch this newsletter for details.

How to Dispose of White Goods

White goods (stove, refrigerators, dishwashers) must be handled separately from your weekly scavenger and recycling pick-up. Please contact Advanced Disposal at 847/272-4145 to schedule these collections. They will typically be scheduled for Wednesdays. There is a cost of \$35 for each item.

During the First Tuesday of the Month e-waste Collection, the Village does not accept any refrigerators, freezers or dehumidifiers, or other large appliances.

Recycling CFLs and Batteries

Drop off bins for recycling CFL's, 4' fluorescent bulbs and batteries are located at the Village Fleet Maintenance Garage behind the Village Hall.

The recycling bins, which are self-serve only, will be available during normal business hours, 7am to 3pm, Monday through Friday. Please note that staff is not available to assist with depositing batteries and light bulbs. These recycling bins will also be available during the first Tuesday of the month electronics collection events.

Batteries, Cell Phones & Eyeglasses

The Northbrook Public Library provides drop-off bins in the lobby for household batteries, only. Please, no car batteries (these can be picked up with regular garbage). The Library also collects Eyeglasses for the Lions Club and Cell Phones for Seniors for the Cook County Sheriff. Items may be dropped off in the lobby during Northbrook Library business hours. Holiday Refuse Collection Schedule and Cart Storage Reminders

Pick-up may be delayed one day.

During the week of Thanksgiving, pick-up for Thursday customers will be Friday and Friday customers will be Saturday. During the week of Christmas and New Year's, pick-up for Thursday and Friday customers will be delayed one day.

The last chance for yard waste collection will be during the week of Thanksgiving, depending on your pick-up date.

Holiday trees will be collected during the month of January. One tree per residence will be collected at the curb. Trees should be free of all lights, garland, tinsel and decorations.

Just a reminder regarding refuse and recycling cart storage: Please ensure that your garbage receptacles are regularly stored behind the front face of your house or within the garage on non-pickup days.

Carts cannot be stored in the front of your property. Also, after collection, carts need to be returned to the storage location within twelve (12) hours after the collection service has been performed.



Honor in the Village Green Park

Three of the four corners of the Village

Green Park contain places of honor.

At the corner of Shermer and Meadow roads is Centennial Plaza. Its engraved bricks honor and celebrate the people who make up the fabric of Shermerville – Northbrook history. The bronze sculptures, by Colorado artist James Haire, represent the future, and depict children at play throughout Northbrook's first century.

“Shermerville Sunset” represents the agricultural roots and salutes the families and businesses whose dedication built our Village. The book the Shermerville boy is reading is inscribed with the words to the song *Village by a Stream*, written by Wescott music teacher Bill Vaananen for the opening of the 2001 Centennial Concert. *Sunset Foods sponsored this statue.*

“Skipping Through Time” features a girl skipping rope and honors community leaders and volunteers. It aptly portrays the delicate balance required to guide the Village through times of rapid growth from

a small rural village to a bustling suburb and its ever-changing history. *LaSalle Bank Northbrook sponsored this statue.*

“Celebrating Northbrook” features a boy with a fire helmet, to symbolize the community in 2001. He honors all those who have given their time and talent to make Northbrook a better place to live. His fire helmet honors all Village employees with a special emphasis on the Fire Department, whose 100th birthday was also celebrated in 2001. The shield on the helmet honors Assistant Fire Chief Wayne Luecht who gave his life in the line of duty, and whose courage and commitment were an inspiration to all. *This statue was sponsored by The Northbrook Centennial 2001 Committee which represented all residents of the Village.*

Monuments at either end of the pathway along the river honor the Village's military heritage. The area at Shermer Road and the river contains a flag pole and Memorial Garden dedicated in October 1972 by the

Northbrook Garden Club.

The plaque reads: *“Dedicated to all Northbrook men and women who have served in the Armed Forces.”*

At the Walters Avenue end of the pathway is a Memorial Plaza built under the leadership of the Historical Society with generous community donations and grants. The James Haire Statue, “For Which It Stands,” honors the American flag and those who died in service to their country. Nestled along the river that gave the town its name is the quiet, reflective plaza with two benches and an engraved granite monument honoring the 43 local men who gave their lives while on Military duty during war and peace time. It was dedicated in September 2009.

There are additional memorial and honorary tributes to Northbrook residents under trees and on benches along the pathways. As you spend time in Village Green Park please keep your eyes open for these “hidden in plain sight” honors.
