Northbrook Village Hall Celebrating 25 Years

Our Village Hall officially opened for Business on November 12, 1990

The former Village Hall, built in 1957, was located on the property between the Library and the Village Hall.

Plans for Northbrook's "new" Village Hall were considered in 1988, after careful evaluation by Village officials, staffers, contractors and architects and representatives from Underwriters Laboratories, before being presented for public opinion. After Village Board approval in 1989, construction began.

The "new" Village Hall stands at 1225 Cedar Lane and boasts warm-colored masonry with limestone window sills and lintels, and a steep roof with slate roofing. The main floor houses General Government offices and Finance operations, and the second floor accommodates the Development and Planning Services Department, Information Technology and Document Imaging, in addition to a staff lunch room and several meeting rooms.

How You Can Avoid Crimes of Opportunity

Avoid Using ATMs at Night

When using a drive-thru ATM, keep your vehicle secured with all doors locked and be aware of any subject(s) approaching. Once the transaction has been completed, immediately leave the ATM premises. It's safer to count your money afterward. Keep your receipt and if there is a discrepancy, contact the bank. If you notice suspicious activity in the area, leave immediately and call 911 with as many details as possible. If confronted by a robber, comply with all demands, try to remember any unique identifying characteristics and call 911.

Making Face to Face Transactions

During exchanges, such as Craigslist transactions or times when an exchange in a public setting is best, residents are allowed to use the Police Department lobby or the public parking lot located at the front of 1401 Landwehr Road.

Keep Your Belongings Close

It's easy for a thief to grab something from a purse when it's left unattended in a shopping cart, on a counter or hanging on the back of a chair in a busy restaurant. Prevention of a crime of opportunity may be as simple as paying attention to your surroundings and not leaving any valuables unattended, even just for a few seconds.

Lock Your Vehicle and Remove Your Valuables!

It's not unusual for someone to report a missing purse or electronic device. Often times these items are taken from an unlocked vehicle, sometimes parked in the caller's driveway or when left unattended for a quick errand.

If you must leave valuables in your car, place them in the trunk before you reach your destination.

In Your Neighborhood

If you see suspicious vehicles driving slowly or repetitively in your neighborhood, report the vehicle and plate number. If you see someone at your neighbor's front door and then walking around the house, call 911 with a description. Residents are reminded to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity by calling 911 immediately.

Notes from Village President Sandy Frum



For some of us, including me, it's hard to believe that this November marks the 25th year at the "new" Village Hall. The former Village Hall, which was built in 1957, was located between the Library and the current Village Hall, covering part of the property that is now known as Freedom Park. The old Village Hall was at one time home to both the Police and the Village government offices on the first floor and served as a warming center for skaters using the rink behind the building in the winter. The basement was also used as a storage area and housed the Village Nurse's office. The old Village Hall was torn down in December 1990.

When what is now the "new" Village Hall opened to the public on November 12, 1990, residents were greeted with a beautiful brick, 22,500 square foot facility with "new meeting rooms, a new paging system, new filing systems and a new chamber (Board Room)." The style of the new Northbrook Village Hall was termed "timeless" in 1990 by architect Howard Decker of the firm Decker & Kemp, as the design "reflected permanence and stability in a rapidly changing community."

In addition to filling present needs as both an administrative headquarters and a community meeting center, the Village Hall provides a strong foundation to accommodate changing technologies and future needs for the foreseeable future. I welcome you to stop by during business hours to see the Village Hall or come to one of our Village Board Meetings to see your local elected and appointed officials in action. Coyotes are Part of the Natural Wildlife In and Around Northbrook

Once again, residents are reminded that winter weather may make our resident coyotes more visible as they venture from the woodlands to forage for food.

Coyotes are part of the natural wildlife that surrounds our community. Generally the coyotes are non-aggressive and spend the vast majority of time in the forest preserves.

- Coyotes eat a variety of foods including plants and small animals and generally cause few problems in the community.

- Although the coyotes are wild animals and do hunt to survive, they will generally shy away from humans.
- Aggressive behavior toward humans is rare but not unknown.
- Children should be cautioned that coyotes are not dogs and they should not chase or try to pet them.
- Coyotes will search out small animals for food so pet owners should be vigilant about watching their small pets when outside.

- Always keep pets on a leash, especially in or around wooded areas.
- Keep cats indoors.
- Do not feed your pet outside or leave pet food outside.
- Never feed the coyotes!

When the Snow Falls...

Our Northbrook Public Works Department will be ready for snow removal operations.

The Village's snow removal operation begins with seven or more trucks spreading de-icing materials on main and secondary streets. As snow begins to accumulate, standby personnel are called in to plow the 537 lane miles of Village owned and maintained streets, municipal parking lots and designated sidewalks.

Help Our Crews

Keep Your Vehicles Off the Streets.

You can help Public Works crews clear our roadways as quickly as possible by keeping vehicles off the street during snow removal operations. The Village's number one concern is the safety of those using our streets.

Important Snow Plowing Facts...

A complete plow-cycle can take at least 6-7 hours depending on weather and traffic.

Thank You for Your Patience!

Snow and ice control efforts give priority to higher traffic Village roadways such as Walters Avenue, Cherry Lane, Pfingsten Road, Techny Road and Shermer Road.

Arterial roads such as Lake-Cook, Dundee, Willow, Sanders, Landwehr and Waukegan are plowed by either the Illinois Department of Transportation or the Cook County Highway Department.

Keep Plowed Snow out of Shoveled Driveways.

Residents can help keep their driveway clear by shoveling snow to the right side of their driveway (as viewed from the home looking at the street). Please note: The Public Works Department does not clear private driveway entrances.

Move Your Vehicle After 2" of Snow

When 2 or more inches of snow fall, it is illegal (by Village Ordinance) to park on Northbrook streets until plowing has been completed. If you park in the street, you may be ticketed and towed.



Make Sure Your Home is Winterized!

Cold weather brings with it the potential for frozen water service lines, water meters and residential fire sprinkler systems.

Winterize your home by doing the following:

- Check thoroughly to identify and seal all cold air drafts near water pipes, including basement windows, crawl space vents and the glass water meter viewing block.
- Install fire retardant insulation around susceptible pipes.
- Install Underwriters Laboratories (UL) listed electric heater tape on pipes that are located on the inside of exterior walls, which may have only marginal insulation. North and west walls are typically most vulnerable.
- If you have an underground lawn sprinkling system, shut off the water supply and properly drain the system.

- Residential Fire Sprinkler Systems are vulnerable too! As a reminder, if you vacation during winter months, set the thermostat no lower than 55°F before leaving to prevent frozen pipes and sprinkler systems.

Holiday Refuse Collection Schedule and Cart Storage Reminders

Pick-up may be delayed one day

During the week of Thanksgiving, pick-up for Thursday customers will be Friday and Friday customers will be Saturday. During the week of Christmas and New Year's, pick-up for Friday customers will be on Saturday.

The last chance for yard waste collection will be on your pick-up day during the week of Thanksgiving. Monday customer's last pick-up date is on Monday, November 30.

Holiday tree disposal

Holiday trees will be collected during the month of January on your regular pick-up date. One tree per residence will be collected at the curb. Trees should be free of all lights, garland, tinsel and decorations.

Holiday Light Recycling Program

Residents are reminded not to throw away old or broken holiday string lights. Holiday lights can be dropped off for recycling at the Village Hall lobby between 8:30am and 4:30pm, or the Public Works Fleet Maintenance Garage, behind the Village Hall, between 7am and 3pm on weekdays.

Northbrook Maintains Class 7 Status with National Flood Insurance Program

Once again, the Village has received good news from FEMA. Following the annual recertification review, the Village has once again maintained a Class 7 Rating with the National Flood Insurance Program's Community Rating System (CRS).

The CRS program allows communities to achieve certain credits (i.e. reduction in flood insurance policy premiums) by implementing specific floodplain outreach activities and development regulations. Currently, there are only 14 communities in Illinois with a Class 7 rating out of 57 participating communities in Illinois.

What Does this Mean for Village Residents?

Residents who live in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) continue to qualify for a 15% reduction on flood insurance and those who do not live in a SFHA area can qualify for a 5% reduction.

However, there are two cases where residents who have federally-backed flood insurance do not receive the CRS discount:

- If they have a Preferred Risk Policy (people outside the 100-yr. floodplain who never had a previous flood claim).
- The first floor of the structure is 1' or more below the Base Flood Elevation on a Post-FIRM building (non-compliant structure).

How are Residents Notified?

All residents and business owners with properties located within a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) were notified by letters mailed in late January.

In addition, this information is posted annually in the Village Newsletter.

Since Northbrook participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), a federal program that offers flood insurance which can be purchased through property and casualty insurance agents, rates are set and do not differ from company to company or agent to agent.
