Union Pacific RR Bridge Update

Reconstruction of the Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) Bridge on Shermer Road is proceeding on schedule.

The steel superstructure is currently being assembled on site, being constructed on temporary foundations on the south side of the existing temporary bridge.

Permanent foundations and bridge abutments are also nearing completion, and near the end of October, the fully constructed bridge will slide into place onto its new foundations. This will require around the clock work during a 72-hour period, and all rail traffic will be halted while the new bridge is put in place.

All work related to the bridge itself, including other finish work and surrounding bridge abutments, is scheduled to be complete by December 31, 2013. However, Shermer Road will not reopen until the roadway can be repaired and resurfaced, likely in the spring of 2014. Village staff is working with the UPRR, IDOT and the Village of Glenview to expedite the roadway reopening.

We encourage you to continue to patronize Northbrook businesses on the south side of the bridge throughout construction!

Notes from Village President Sandy Frum



Over the past several weeks, a number of Northbrook's advisory commissions have been vetting two proposed high-profile developments; the proposed Walmart at 1000 Skokie Boulevard and the proposed Mariano's and luxury apartment complex at 770 Skokie Boulevard, near the corner of Skokie and Dundee.

Recently I have received questions asking why the members of the Village Board are not speaking out or commenting on the Walmart zoning application. I want to take this opportunity to remind everyone that the Walmart

petition is proceeding through the Village review process. It is currently before our Plan Commission, which will make a recommendation to the Village Board after it completes all public hearings. Once the matter is officially before us, I suspect Village Board members will have a lot to say. However, while this application is pending at the Plan Commission, it would not be appropriate for any of us to comment on the specifics. No one should take the Village Board's silence as a lack of interest, or as a pre-disposition on our part one way or the other. We pride ourselves as being a Village that provides all those who file applications in our town with a fair, objective hearing process.

With that said, as of this writing, both proposed developments are still at the public hearing stage and I encourage you to visit www.northbrook.il.us for updates or to sign up for Northbrook Notify at www.northbrook.il.us/NorthbrookNotify and submit your email address for agenda notifications.

Northbrook Nurses Club & the Lending Closet

The Northbrook Nurses Club was organized in 1956 as a professional club for Registered Nurses. Over the years the nurses serviced the community with education, first aid for Northbrook events, blood screening, blood pressure testing, CEUs, thousands of dollars in nursing scholarships, and a free lending closet of medical equipment. After 57 years of service, the Club will cease to exist as of November 1, 2013. The Lending Closet closed its door on September 1 with the hope that another organization would volunteer to operate it in the future. The Village and the Park District are currently working to reopen the Lending Closet and will have more information in the November newsletter. I'd like to send a very special thank you to the Nurses Club and its membership for 57 years of service to the Village.

Refuse and Recycling Cart Exchanges

Just a quick reminder: Each resident may exchange either their refuse or recycling cart for a different size at any time between now and December 31, 2013 at no cost. In upcoming years, with our new Advanced Disposal contract, during the month of September, residents may change cart sizes at no additional cost. If a cart size change is requested any other time of the year, there will be a cost of \$20.00/cart. If a resident wishes to swap cart sizes and avoid the \$20.00 fee, the resident can bring the cart to Advanced Disposal, 2800 Shermer Road and a different cart size will be provided at no additional cost.

Telephone Solicitors Warning

It was recently brought to my attention that telephone solicitors have been requesting donations from residents and implying that the donations will benefit local police departments, presumably in the Village of Northbrook. Our Police Department is fully supported by tax dollars. The Village, its Police and Fire Departments, and personnel are not telephone solicitors. Funds generated by these telephone solicitors do not benefit the Village of Northbrook or the Police and Fire Departments. The Police Department recommends against donating money to such solicitors.

Got Leaves? Here’s How to Handle Them

Before you begin to rake your lawn, residents are reminded that there are three landscape disposal options: composting, mulching and collection. Collection reminders: Yard waste must be in bio-degradable bags with yard waste stickers attached or in a 32 gallon can marked **Yard Waste** with the sticker attached on the handle.

Stickers are \$1.95 each and are available from Advanced Disposal (847/272-4145), the Village Hall and Dominick’s. Bags/Stickers are available at Northbrook Ace Hardware stores, Jewel, Red’s Garden Center, Sunset and Walgreens in Glenview. Ferraro Garden Spot sells bags only. Landscape waste pick-up runs through the end of November.






Northbrook Permitting Just Got Easier

This summer the Development and Planning Services Department launched several new enhancements to its website. These new elements include a new Permit Center interface, online inspection scheduling, and interactive permit applications. The Permit Center, pictured left, has been enhanced to provide easier navigation to Department webpages



The Residential Permits section, pictured right, now provides an interactive model where visitors can select on a project they'd like to get started on. Each project opens a separate page that includes information about application requirements, fees, inspections, and other useful information to help plan a successful project.



In addition to these pages, the Department now offers online inspection scheduling. A screen shot from the online inspection scheduling page is shown left. Users can request a permit inspection for their project by completing this form; whether you're at home or on the go, scheduling inspections just got easier!

Village Offers GIS Technology on Website

Northbrook is now offering an online interactive map powered by an application known as MapOffice.

MapOffice offers detailed property information and other customized tools through the Village's Geographic Information System (GIS) software. GIS is a map-based program that can be used to locate, mark and present different types of geographic information including polling places, school district boundaries, population information, county and municipal borders, income and education levels, and flood plain areas.


