# Business Briefs

## Development Activity in Northbrook

You may have noticed or heard that a significant amount of major development is either under construction, recently approved by the Village Board or under consideration by the Village. The following is a quick snapshot of development activity in the Village.

### **Under Construction**

In August, site work began on the **NorthShore 770** mixed use development project located on the northwest corner of Dundee Road and Skokie Boulevard. The development will consist of a **Mariano's** anchored shopping center and a 347-unit luxury apartment building. Other commercial tenants will be **Zengeler Cleaners, Sleepy's, Kriser's, Hair Cuttery, PNC Bank, Noodles & Company, Chipotle, Fuddruckers, and Panera Bread**.

Also in August, construction began on the 52,500 square foot **MeadowPark Office** development at the northwest corner of Founder Drive and Techny Road, a portion of which will house a **Lurie Children's Hospital** outpatient facility and a **Bright Horizons** child day care facility.

The Senior Lifestyles Corporation has completed its first phase of **North Shore Place**, a 188-unit assisted living facility, at 1000 Sunset Ridge Boulevard.

**Covenant Village of Northbrook** is in the process of constructing a new 56-unit, three-story independent senior living apartment building on its campus at 2625 Techny Road.

The Essex Corporation recently completed construction of the first phase of **The Lodge**, an independent senior housing development, has begun construction on the second phase of the development, and hopes to begin construction on additional phases in the not too distant future.

### **Recently Approved by the Village Board**

**Waterway Gas & Wash** recently received Village Board approval to construct a gas station/car wash/convenience store at 2370 Waukegan Road, just north of the **Willow Festival Shopping Center**.

GK Holste LLC recently received Village Board approval to operate a 22,000 square sports training facility on Holste Road.

Village Green Business Center LLC received Village approval to construct a new three-story mixed use building at 1312-1318 Shermer Road in downtown Northbrook. The building will include first floor retail and 10 apartment units on the upper floors. The retail tenants are not known at this time.

Kogen Zivin Friedman recently received concept plan approval by the Village Board for a 21-unit detached single family home development on a site located in the 3800 block of Dundee Road. The homes will range in size from 1,800 to 2,500 square feet.

### **Under Consideration by the Village**

RJ Development and Koelsch Senior Communities have submitted an application seeking approval of a proposed 69-bed memory care facility on a site located behind J. Alexander's along Lake Cook Road.

Pulte Homes has submitted a formal application seeking approval of a proposed 18-unit single family detached development located on a site generally located on the northeast corner of Willow and Landwehr roads. The homes would range in size from 2,400 to 3,000 square feet.

Also, in the early stages of the development review process, Edward R. James is proposing a 38-unit detached single family home development located on a site on the northeast corner of Waukegan and Voltz roads. The homes would be between 2,600 to 3,000 square feet.

The property owners of seven lots located along the 1200 block of Shermer Road have placed their properties under contract with Jacobs Custom Homes. The developer has yet to submit a proposal for the site to the Village.

# Notes from Village President Sandy Frum



Last month, a significant storm blew into Northbrook and many other towns in the region, causing downed trees, downed power lines, and long-term power outages. I have several suggestions how you and your family can be better prepared in the event of disasters that last more than a few hours or days.

## **Are You Prepared?**

First, for preparedness information, please visit [www.ready.gov](http://www.ready.gov) It's important to Prepare, Plan, Stay Informed and Know the Risks. For example, does your family have a basic disaster supply kit?

Second, I suggest you visit [www.ComEd.com](http://www.ComEd.com) to learn more about dealing with power outages and how to alert ComEd about outages and downed power lines. Do you have surge protectors on appliances and electronics? If you experience a power outage, did you know it is important to unplug your appliances to avoid surges when the power is restored? Should you experience a power surge and see or smell smoke coming from an outlet or electronic device, contact 911. Learn more tips, as well as how to report an outage via text, on ComEd's website.

Lastly, I encourage all residents and businesses to sign up for Northbrook Notify. If we can't reach you, we can't notify you. Northbrook's mass notification system is used to inform residents and businesses about important information specific to our community as necessary. During the September storm, residents were relieved to get a message, either by email or text, from the Village with the phone number to contact ComEd and details about Public Work's storm debris pick-up plan. Northbrook Notify also has an option to call mobile and landlines for urgent emergencies and important messages. ## **Snow and Ice Control Preparations**

Speaking of being prepared, the Village has already begun its preparations for the coming winter season, including purchasing

salt. The Village participated in the State of Illinois' joint bid for salt and received pricing that was amongst the lowest on the bid.

### Play it Safe on Halloween

Here are a few safety tips for parents to remind their Trick or Treaters:

- Walk in groups or with a trusted adult and stay on the sidewalks.
- Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see you.

- Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before eating them.
- Avoid eating homemade Halloween treats made by strangers. Eat only factory-wrapped treats.
- Wear well-fitting masks, costumes and comfortable shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips and falls.
- Keep candle-lit jack-o’lanterns and luminaries out of the reach of pets and small children, and never leave them unattended or use electric candles.
- Drivers are reminded to watch out for trick-or-treaters and to drive safely.

## Regulations Regarding Political Signs

**The Village of Northbrook supports every citizen’s right to free speech.**

As election time approaches, residents and businesses are reminded of the regulations that are in place regarding the proper placement of political signs in the Village.

Political signs cannot be placed in the parkway, the publicly-owned area between the sidewalk and the road, but are allowed in your yard. They also cannot be placed in other public properties such as schools, parks or the commuter parking lots.



Each property can have one sign for each candidate or ballot issue position. If you have a corner lot, you can have one sign on each street frontage.

Individual signs cannot exceed six square feet in area.

Please make sure your signs are posted following these simple rules so that you can properly show support for the candidate of your choice. Removing illegal political signs is an extremely time consuming task for Village personnel and we ask for your cooperation. ## Got Leaves? Here's How to Handle Them

Residents are reminded that there are three disposal options for yard waste: composting, mulching and collection.

**Collection reminders:** Yard waste must be in biodegradable bags with yard waste stickers attached or in a 32 gallon can marked *Yard Waste* with the sticker attached on the handle. Stickers are \$1.95 each and are available from Advanced Disposal (847/272-4145) or the Village Hall.

Bags/Stickers are available at Northbrook Ace Hardware stores (1941 Cherry Ln & 3101 Dundee Rd), Jewel (2775 Pfingsten Rd, Glenview), Red's Garden Center (3460 Dundee Rd.), Sunset Foods (1127 Church St.) and Walgreens (2871 Pfingsten Rd, Glenview). Pickup runs through the end of November.

## Fire Safety Tips to Review with Your Family

In addition to checking your smoke alarm every month, and replacing it every 10 years, here are some Fire Safety Tips to review.

Heating equipment is a leading cause of home fire deaths. Almost half of home heating equipment fires are reported during the months of December, January, and February. Some simple steps can prevent most heating-related fires from happening.

### Safety Tips

- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment, such as the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable heater.
- Only use heating equipment that has the label of a recognized testing laboratory.
- Never use your oven for heating.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Maintain heating equipment and chimneys by having them cleaned and inspected annually by a qualified professional.

- Turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- For fuel burning space heaters, always use the proper fuel as specified by the manufacturer.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to prevent sparks from flying into the room and burn only dry, seasoned wood. Allow ashes to cool before disposing in a metal container, which is kept a safe distance from the home.
- For wood burning stoves, install chimney connectors and chimneys following manufacturer's instructions or have a professional do the installation.
- Make sure all fuel-burning equipment is vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning.
- Install and maintain carbon monoxide (CO) alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning.
- If you smell gas in your gas heater, do not attempt to light the appliance. Turn off all the controls and open doors and windows. Call a gas service person.

## Be Safe, Replace!

Is your smoke alarm still working? A smoke alarm with a dead or missing battery is the same as having no smoke alarm at all. A smoke alarm only works when it is properly installed and regularly maintained. Maintain your smoke alarms according to the manufacturer's instructions. Below are some general maintenance tips.


- Test the alarm monthly.
- Replace the batteries at least twice every year.
- Replace the entire smoke alarm every 10 years.

# You'll Find Great Mapping Tools on the Village Website

**Northbrook is now offering an online interactive map called MapOffice.**



MapOffice offers property information and other customized tools through the Village's Geographic Information System (GIS) program. MapOffice is a map-based application that can be used to locate and display different types of geographic data.



## Bicycle Routes Around Town

Northbrook has a variety of bicycle routes and trails displayed as a Custom Overlay in MapOffice. To view the bicycle routes, click on the *Layers button* in the upper right hand corner, select *Northbrook*, and click on the box *Bicycle Route* to turn on the layer to display bicycle routes symbolized by comfort level, trail, or sidewalk.

You can also use the *Measure Distance Tool* on the left panel to plan how far your next bike ride or walk will be.


It's easy to use. Just open the app, select your issue, and take a picture - the app knows the location and who can fix it for you.

No matter which way you choose to contact the Village, either by calling 847/272-5050 during business hours, going to [www.northbrook.il.us](http://www.northbrook.il.us) or using the Smart Phone app, our system ensures the right person is contacted and the concern is addressed quickly.

To see your property, enter your address in MapOffice by visiting [www.northbrook.il.us/MapOffice](http://www.northbrook.il.us/MapOffice) and click on the Interactive Village Map link. From there you can explore Northbrook using MapOffice's tools and layers.

## Parcel Summary

The Parcel Summary Task (featured left) provides information about a specific property including the PIN, school districts, voting information, and service information, such as garbage collection days. To use the *Parcel Summary Task*, first enter an address in the *Find* box and select *Go*. Next click on the *Parcel Summary Task* to view the information.



## Zoning - Interested in zoning information about a property?

Turn on the *Zoning Custom Overlay* in the *Layers tab* to view the Village's zoning. (See example above.) Click on a *zoning polygon* to get more information or explore the hyperlinks to the Village's zoning codes and diagrams.

# Historian's Corner

Take a Step Back in Time - Celebrate the 40th Anniversary of the Historical Society at the Cemetery Walk

Many tombstone restorations have occurred at St. Peter Cemetery this year, including the Schermer monument restored by the Northbrook Historical Society. There are a total of eight cemeteries in Northbrook, five of which are pioneer cemeteries. The cemeteries and dates of the first burials are:

**c1837 - Aux Plaine**, the first cemetery in town on Sanders and Dundee roads. Hidden in plain sight for decades, a single monument, dedicated in 2013, marks this abandoned cemetery.

**1839 - Northfield Oakwood** on Milwaukee Ave. There are 14 Civil War soldiers buried at Northfield Oakwood Cemetery - more than at any other cemetery in the Township.

**1849 - Northfield Union Cemetery** on Dundee Road, just west of Pfingsten Road. Members of the Huehl, Landwehr, Lorenz, Pfingsten, Schermer and Walter families - six of the 18 pioneer families with Northbrook streets named for them are buried here.

**1850 - North Northfield** on Dundee Road, just east of Charlemagne Drive. Members of the Bach, Walters, Wessling and Kiest families - four of the 18 pioneer families with Northbrook streets named for them, are buried at North Northfield Cemetery. Also buried here, in marked graves, are six Civil War veterans.

**1859 - St. Peter Cemetery** on Shermer Road, south of Willow Road. Members of the Dehne, Landwehr, Lorenz, Holste, Huehl, Pfingsten, Schermer and Voltz families - eight of the 18 pioneer families with Northbrook streets named for them. Seven Civil War Veterans are buried here.
