Northbrook Residents Continue to Save on Electricity Rates

The North Shore Electricity Aggregation Consortium (NSEAC) has secured electricity rates of 4.990 cents per kilowatt-hour (kWh) for June 2013 through May 2014 billing cycles for residential and eligible small commercial customers for the second year of a three-year contract with MC Squared Energy Services (mc2).

ComEd recently announced that its residential rate for the same period will be 6.047 cents per kWh. The Consortium's rate represents a modest 3% increase over the current Consortium rate of 4.836 cents/kWh, and results in savings of more than 17% when compared to ComEd's new rates.

Since the program began in June 2012, the 70,000 residents and businesses of the consortium communities are projected to realize savings of over \$26 million off of ComEd rates. Specifically in Northbrook, residents are projected to save an average of over \$400 in the first 12 months. In total, Northbrook customers are projected to save over \$4.7 million in the period of June 2012 – May 2013.

Vehicle Stickers & Pet Licenses Available in June

Our easy to use renewal applications will be mailed to your home or business at the end of May.

All motor vehicles registered to a Northbrook address (residential or business) are required to have Village vehicle stickers. Only persons residing within the corporate limits of the Village are allowed to purchase a Northbrook vehicle sticker.

Your mailing should contain all vehicle and animal applications as applicable to each household or business. Carefully review the form and return both copies to the Village. If either your vehicle or pet information has changed, modifications may be made directly on the form. Your stickers/tags, along with your receipt, will be mailed to you promptly after June 1. Stickers must be displayed by midnight, June 30.

Persons living in unincorporated Northbrook must only purchase a Cook County vehicle sticker. These are available at the Northfield Township office, 847/724-8300.

New this Year! Support 4th of July and Receive a Special Vehicle Sticker

Residents will have an option to make a donation, minimum \$20 per sticker to help support Northbrook's 4th of July festivities. There are only 2,000 special vehicle stickers, so purchase yours early.

Notes from Village President Sandy Frum



I wanted to begin this month's message with a sincere thank you, as I am pleased to have the privilege to serve as your Village President for the next four years. At the May 14 Village Board meeting I, along with Trustees Michael Scolaro, Todd Heller, Kathryn Ciesla and Village Clerk Debbie Ford, will officially be sworn in to office. On behalf of the Village Board, we look forward to continuing to serve the residents and business in Northbrook.

In my first term as Village President, my goals were to improve storm water management, update the Comprehensive Plan, and to renew the Village's focus on the downtown. These goals were achieved,

yet other critical decisions remain. We are now in the process of implementing the Stormwater Master Plan, revitalizing our Central Business District and making decisions about future developments, in addition to maintaining a balanced budget.

Northbrook's Fiscal Year begins May 1.

I am pleased to announce that the Village Board once again passed a balanced budget for Fiscal Year 2013/14. A copy of our Annual Budget is available at www.northbrook.il.us/Budget. Please see page 6 for more information.

The State of Illinois' ongoing fiscal crisis continues to threaten the Village's fiscal stability. The State has failed to make meaningful changes to our Police and Fire Pension benefits; they have suggested that our local sales tax be redistributed to other communities; they have attempted to raid the Distributive Fund to balance their budget. All these put great pressure on the local property tax. I will continue to educate and lobby our Legislators to protect our sources of revenue.

Business development relates directly to our financial security. We must continue to have a diverse tax base. Northbrook has a great diversity of business in our borders, more than most citizens realize. It's also important to consider Northbrook Court and our other retail centers as we plan for our downtown developments and our last few vacant parcels of property, particularly the northwest corner of Dundee and Skokie and the 1000 block of Skokie Blvd.

We must continue to approach development in a thorough, thoughtful way in order to guide the Board's decisions for our community now, as they will certainly impact our future.

Skokie Boulevard Development Projects.

770 Northshore

The developer of the proposed Mariano's and luxury apartment building at the northwest corner of Dundee Road and Skokie Boulevard has submitted a formal application, which is currently being reviewed for its completeness and compliance with Village regulations. Once staff's review of the application is complete, the date of the Plan Commission public hearing will be set. The very earliest the public hearing could occur would be early June.

1000 Skokie Boulevard

Walmart has been in contact with Village staff regarding its intent to submit a formal application for the property at 1000 Skokie Boulevard. As of the date of writing this story, Walmart has yet to submit an application.

Construction Season Begins

Now that warmer weather is here, so is road construction both locally and regionally.

Below are highlights of Village projects and other regional construction projects scheduled this year.

Village of Northbrook Projects

The Village of Northbrook strives to maintain the Village's water, sewer, and surface infrastructure in a safe and stable condition. There are several projects scheduled for the 2013 "construction season" and web pages have been established for each of the projects to provide residents with current information on the status of these projects. Projects include Asphalt Street Resurfacing, Water Main Replacements, Concrete Street Rehabilitation, Stormwater Management Projects, including Ridge Road/Lee Road, Cedar Lane, Western Avenue/Oak Avenue and the Shermer Road Underpass.

Lake Cook Road and Waukegan Road

The Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways will be reconstructing a portion of Lake Cook Road and Waukegan Road in 2013. Construction on Lake Cook Road will take place between Deer Lake Road and Carlise Avenue. Work on Waukegan Road will take place between the Edens Spur ramp to north of Lake Cook Road by the animal hospital in Deerfield. Construction is began in April and is expected to be completed by the end of October 2013.

Widening of Willow Road-Two Year Project

The Illinois Department of Transportation will be reconstructing a portion of Willow Road from approximately Waukegan Road to the Edens Expressway. The project includes widening the roadway and improving pedestrian safety through signalized crossings and widened sidewalks. Construction began in April and is expected to be completed by October 2014.

Shermer Road Rail Bridge Reconstruction

Union Pacific Railroad

Following the train derailment and bridge collapse on July 4, 2012, Union Pacific Railroad has committed to having the bridge and roadway open to vehicular traffic by September 2014. Currently they are working toward completing construction ahead of schedule. Fabrication of the bridge structure is in progress and construction on site is expected to begin in early fall 2013.

They are a way to connect with your neighbors in a completely casual atmosphere. Every Friday evening starting around 6pm, from Memorial Day through Labor Day, a neighborhood gathering will be held in someone's driveway, designated by a Pink Flamingo. The host provides the driveway. No effort needed! Everyone brings their own lawn chairs, beverages, kids, snacks, etc. Gatherings may last 30 minutes or a couple hours, depending on the group assembled on any given evening.

Village Board Approves Budget

At their regular meeting on April 16, 2013, the Village Board of Trustees approved the Annual Budget for Fiscal Year 2013/2014, which begins May 1, 2013.

Northbrook's local economy is steadily recovering. Sales tax revenue has exceeded the budget projections in 22 of the past 24 months. At the same time, residents and businesses are investing in their futures in Northbrook, as evidenced by an increase in building permits. Sky Harbor Business Park occupancy rates remain high, our retail businesses remain strong, new plans are being proposed for downtown retail space, two new Senior Housing Facilities are currently under construction and more senior housing is being proposed at Covenant Village as well as in the Sanders Road and Lake Cook Road area. In the next few months, the Village expects to see a formal development proposal for a Mariano's grocery store, 20,000 square feet of additional retail and a 10-story luxury apartment building for the vacant property at the corner of Dundee Road and Skokie Boulevard. We also expect a proposal for a Wal-Mart Supercenter at 1000 Skokie Boulevard. Whether or not these proposals are ultimately approved by the Village Board, it is clear that the business community continues to see Northbrook as an attractive place to grow and expand.

The total approved budget for Fiscal Year 2013/2014 is \$86,296,528, which represents a 1% decrease from the total budget approved for the previous fiscal year. The General Fund, which provides for the basic public service operations of the Village (Police, Fire and Public Works, Code Enforcement, Planning and Economic Development among others) accounts for 48% of the total budget and projects a surplus for next fiscal year of \$444,550.

The Fiscal Year 2013/2014 budget also includes capital projects of \$16.1 million to continue the Village Board's strong commitment to maintaining and improving our significant infrastructure assets. Significant projects included for this year include:

- Street maintenance - \$4.5 million
- Water distribution system improvements - \$3 million
- Water main replacement - \$2.2
- Storm water mitigation - \$1.68 million

Together, the Village Board and staff have responded to the realities of the last several years with policies and processes that have focused our efforts to meaningfully and appropriately address the short- and long-term financial health of our Village government. This careful management by the Village Board and staff has provided the flexibility to adjust our resources as necessary in order to meet the changing service needs of the community. Constraining costs without diminishing quality services, a steady growth in certain revenue streams, and strong legislative and management oversight keeps the Village in a strong and enviable position moving into the coming fiscal years.

Historian's Corner

Northbrook's First Telephone

In Shermerville, the first phone was probably installed in the railroad station in the 1880s when a telephone was connected to the Chicago-Milwaukee Railroad line.

That phone was removed a few years later for lack of use. By 1905, there were 12 phone customers in Shermerville. Five customers were served on one-party lines and seven on four-party lines. Party lines mean that four customers shared the same line and anyone on that line could listen to the other customer's conversations. A few of the early numbers were: 0 for the Shermerville Fire Department; 3 for the Illinois Brick Company and 9 for Bartelme's Café in the Northfield Inn.

Peter Bellert, who opened a harness shop across the street from the Lorenz Wagon Shop in the late 1880s, eventually became manager of the telephone exchange.

During his time as manager, the switchboard was located in this home above the store. His daughter Katie operated the switchboard. When a call came in she would connect the caller to the phone number.

Northbrook phone calls were connected via operators and switchboards until the telephone company built a new building on Walters Avenue in the 1950s. On July 1, 1955, the direct dialing system went into effect. Northbrook was assigned the telephone exchange of Crestwood - 2, later it was shortened to CR-2 and now is 272. For many years this was the only telephone exchange in town.

It was just forty years ago in April that the first cell phone call was made in Time Square, New York using a "brick" phone. Recent events have highlighted the way mobile phones and Social Media have changed our lives.
