Quarterly Business Briefs...

Temporary Business Signs

Often a business likes to display temporary signage to promote special occasions such as a grand opening or the fact that it is providing a new product or service. A temporary sign is defined as a sign or advertising display constructed of cloth, canvas, fabric, paper, plywood or other light material and intended to be displayed on the exterior or within a yard of a building for a short period of time. If your business wishes to display a temporary sign, there are a few things to remember:

- A sign permit application must be submitted to, and approved by the Village prior to displaying any temporary business signs.
- The Zoning Code limits how long temporary signs can be displayed. A business is allowed to display temporary signs for up to 30 days in any 365-day period. This means a business may display one sign for a total of 30 days, display a different sign for one day each, or some combination in between.
- The fee for temporary sign permits is \$45.00 per sign and/or occasion. If a business would like to display temporary signage throughout different times of the year, a sign permit must be applied for, and a fee paid each time.
- Temporary business signs may only be placed on private property; they shall not be displayed in the public right-of-way.
- A temporary business wall sign can be no larger than 100 square feet or 5% of the wall face, whichever is less, and may be displayed no higher than 20 feet above grade.
- A temporary business free-standing sign can be no larger than 100 square feet and must meet certain set-back and height requirements.

Solicitation Information: Solicitors at Your Door... and on the Phone

Door to Door

Every year, especially during the spring and summer months, the Northbrook Police Department receives calls from residents concerned about the number of solicitors in our neighborhoods going door to door. The law guarantees solicitors the right to solicit in the Village; however they must abide by the regulations in the Village ordinance governing solicitation. The Police Department screens all solicitor permit requests before a permit is issued.



Door to door solicitation permits fall into two categories:

Commercial – Commercial permits are issued to solicitors that are selling goods and services door to door. This would include people hanging flyers on your doorknobs. Commercial solicitors should have a Village permit with their photo on it with the name of the company and dates for which the permit is valid.

Not for Profit or Charitable Groups – This category includes religious and political groups that are asking for donations. By law, they do not need a permit to solicit, but they do need to prove to the Village that they are a charitable organization in good standing with the Attorney General's office. Those that contact the Police Department are issued a letter acknowledging their request to be in Northbrook and are advised as to the regulations set forth in our ordinance.

Permits are not required for all door-to-door solicitors. People who come to your door and do NOT ask you for any donations, such as political candidates or certain religious organizations, do not need any type of permit or acknowledgement from the Police Department.

Those who do not want their privacy disturbed should display a “NO SOLICITORS” sign on their property. These signs/stickers can be obtained from the Village Hall, a local hardware store or made up by the homeowner. If you have a “No Solicitor” or any other similar notice on your property, a solicitor should not ring your doorbell or hang any type of flyer on your door handle, no matter under what category they fall. If residents have any questions concerning solicitors, call 847/564-2060, ext. 2155.

Phone Solicitors

The National Do Not Call Registry at www.donotcall.gov gives you the opportunity to limit the number of telemarketing calls received at home. Most telemarketers should not call your number once it has been on the registry for 31 days. If they do, you can file a complaint on the Do Not Call website or by calling 888/382-1222. The Village does not regulate phone solicitations. ☀



National Take Back Initiative

The Northbrook Police Invite All to Participate in the National Take Back Initiative by Disposing of Unused Prescription Drugs on Saturday, April 30, 10am to 2pm at the Northbrook Police Department

Last year, as part of a nationwide effort, the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) sponsored a National Take Back Initiative and collected over 242,000 pounds of prescription drugs, cocaine, heroin and hallucinogens combined. Expired, unused or unwanted controlled substances in homes are a potential source of supply that fuel drug abuse and are an unacceptable risk to public health and safety. Please participate in this event by bringing your unwanted, unused medications to the Northbrook Police Station front lot at 1401 Landwehr Road on Saturday, April 30, between 10am and 2pm.

Please note: The Village continues to be a sponsor of the “Save-A-Star” program, whose purpose is to collect and safely dispose of unwanted and unused medications. The “Save-A-Star” collection box, located in the lobby of the Police Department, is accessible 24/7/365. ☀

Physical Abuse An injury to the child that is not an accident such as beating, burning, biting, shaking, kicking, cutting or punching.

Emotional Abuse Maltreatment of the a child such as insulting, rejecting, manipulating, criticizing, screaming or withholding love.

Sexual Abuse Any sexual contact with a child including pornography, photographs/films, rape, or fondling.

Neglect Failure to provide for a child's basic physical, emotional, medical or educational needs.

The Historian's Corner

Did you know that the Northbrook Historical Society is the "Keeper of the Stories?"

A Piece of History about our Little Village by the Stream...



Today, the Sherman tombstone overlooks Sherman Road at St. Peter Cemetery. Joel Sherman is buried in the Deerfield Cemetery.

■ In 1838, Joel "Sterling" Sherman came from Connecticut with three generations of his extended family. He purchased 159 acres located on either side of Waukegan Road near Dundee Road for \$1.25 per acre. The area became known as Sherman for the post office he established. Northbrook School District 28 began with the school he started. After the Township was formed in 1850, the area was known as East Northfield after its geographic location.

■ At one time, the extended Sherman family owned more than 1,000 acres in the Village. Piece by piece, most of it was sold to new settlers. In 1875, Frederick Shermer purchased a large parcel of Sherman land in what is now downtown Northbrook. The first train station was erected on a portion of this land. The parcel also included what we now know as the Village Green Park and the shopping centers.

■ Neither of the men lived to see an incorporated village or a road named for them. The road through town was renamed Shermer after the Village was incorporated as Shererville in 1901. Nearly 100 years later, and just prior to the Village Centennial in 2001, the road that runs south of Glenbrook North High School was renamed Sherman Road.
