

Make Your Vote Count on April 9

Voting on Tuesday, April 9 will be at your precinct polling place from 6am – 7pm.

For this election, voters will elect: the Village President, three Village Trustees, the Village Clerk, three Library Trustees, three Park District Commissioners and members of School Boards. There will also be an Advisory Referendum for Northfield Township residents.

Northbrook Village Hall is open for Early Voting.

Early Voting is available until April 6. The hours for early voting at the Village Hall are Monday through Saturday, 9am to 5pm. A government-issued photo ID is required for early voting.

Forgot to Register to Vote?

For those who changed their name or address, and didn't re-register to vote, you can still take advantage of *grace period registration and voting* until April 6. However, guidelines limit when and where grace period registrants can vote.

PACE Programs

With high gas prices, many residents and employees are exploring alternative modes of transportation.

Most people are aware of Pace buses that serve the suburbs of the metropolitan area. In addition to the fixed bus routes, Pace offers alternative modes of transportation. They include the following:



Traditional Vanpool. The Traditional Vanpool is designed to transport a group of 5-13 people to work in a Pace van. Employees that live and work near one another and share similar schedules can form a group that conveniently gets them between home and work. Each rider pays a low monthly fare based on distance and number of participants. This covers all costs of the vanpool including fuel, maintenance, insurance and tolls.

Metra Feeders. The Metra Feeder allows for a Pace van to be parked at a Metra station near the worksite, so that 5-13 participants can take the train and then use the van to complete the commute. To qualify for the program, at least half of the participants must purchase a Metra monthly pass or 10-ride ticket.

Pace Rideshare. Pace RideShare is a free, easy and convenient matching service that connects commuters who are interested in forming a carpool in and around Northeastern Illinois. The website gives residents and employees in the greater Chicago area the ability to identify potential carpool partners quickly and securely.

Notes from Village President Sandy Frum



of Willow Road from approximately Waukegan Road east to the Edens Expressway. The project includes widening the roadway to four lanes and improving pedestrian safety through signalized crossings and widened sidewalks. Construction has begun and is expected to be complete by October 2014. This project will have three stages of construction where one lane will remain open in each direction, with turning lanes at major intersections.

Lake Cook Road/Waukegan Road Construction

The Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways will be reconstructing a portion of Lake Cook Road and Waukegan Road this year. Construction on Lake Cook Road will take place between Deer Lake Road and Ellendale/Birchwood Road. Work on Waukegan Road will take place between the Edens Spur ramp to north of Lake Cook Road (approximately the traffic signal at McDonalds.) Construction is expected to be complete by the end of October 2013.

Fiscal Year 2013/14 Budget Public Hearing

A copy of the proposed 2013/2014 Annual Village Budget is available for public inspection at www.northbrook.il.us/Budget, at the Northbrook Public Library, and at the Village Hall during business hours. Please consider participating in the budget process by attending the public hearing and providing input on Tuesday, April 16, at 7:30pm at the Village Hall. In addition to our annual projects slated for this summer, such as infrastructure and street repairs, you'll see several larger construction and development projects in and around Northbrook in the coming months. This includes the widening of Willow Road in Northfield and the reconstruction of the Lake Cook Road and Waukegan Road intersection outlined below. Also, there are a number of approved and potential local developments in the Village, which are detailed on page 6.

A Message for All Northbrook Pet Owners

The Northbrook Police Department's Animal Control Officer would like to remind pet owners to be considerate of their neighbors and community by obeying our local ordinances.

- Do not allow your dog to bark excessively as to cause a disturbance to your neighbors.
- Village ordinances and common sense dictate that your dog should always be walked on a leash and never be allowed off your property without restraint.
- Always pick up after your dog eliminates. These rules also apply in parks, on school grounds and in open fields.

- The leash law applies to cats as well. Cats allowed to roam are in danger from cars, disease, other animals, poisons, parasites and abusive people to name a few. They lead contented and much longer lives if they remain indoors.

Lost Pets

Even though we all try extremely hard not to lose our animals, accidents do occur.

It is imperative that your pet is wearing proper, up-to-date identification tags including a current village license along with a rabies and name tag. Having your animal microchipped will further ensure recovery of your pet if their collar is lost. Contact your veterinarian for details.

If your pet is lost, immediately report it to the Northbrook Police at 847/564-2060.

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

While April is Child Abuse Prevention Month, you can make a big difference year-round through small acts that help protect children, strengthen families, promote traits that help protect families — and, ultimately, prevent the abuse and neglect of children.

What Constitutes Child Abuse?

- Physical Abuse - An injury to the child that is not an accident such as beating, burning, biting, shaking, kicking, cutting or punching.
- Emotional Abuse - Maltreatment of the child such as insulting, rejecting, manipulating, criticizing, screaming or withholding love.

- Sexual Abuse - Any sexual contact with a child including pornography, photographs/films, rape, or fondling.
- Neglect - Failure to provide for a child's basic physical, emotional, medical or educational needs.

*You may be a child's only lifeline to safety.
Please pay attention to the treatment of children around you.*



Cost Savings Continue with Electrical Aggregation

The Village will be entering its second year of a three year contract with MC Squared Energy Services beginning June 1 for its electrical aggregation program.

The current rate of 4.836 cents/kWh, which has been in effect since late June 2012, is projected to save the average homeowner over \$400 through May 2013, with an overall savings to the community of \$4.7 million over ComEd's prices. Residents will continue to benefit from this contract in the upcoming year.

Rates have been locked, starting June 1, 2013 at 4.990 cents/kWh, which will continue to provide substantial savings over ComEd rates. The increase comes in part by the upward pressure in electricity commodity costs along with new cost increases mandated by the State of Illinois. This modest increase of only 3% will help to keep Northbrook's residential and certain small business electricity rates among the lowest in the area. Dispose of Unused Medications

The Northbrook Police Invite All to Participate in the National Take Back Initiative by Disposing of Unused Prescription Drugs on Saturday, April 27, from 10am to 2pm at the Northbrook Police Department.

In the four previous Take-Back events, the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), in conjunction law enforcement partners, has collected more than 2 million pounds (1,018 tons) of unwanted or expired medications for proper disposal. Please participate in this event by bringing your unwanted, unused medications to the Northbrook Police Station front lot at 1401 Landwehr Road.

The National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day aims to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposal, while also educating the public about the potential for abuse of these medications.

Please note: The Village continues to be a sponsor of the *Save-A-Star* program, whose purpose is to collect and safely dispose of unwanted and unused medications. The *Save-A-Star* collection box, located in the lobby of the Police Department, 1401 Landwehr Road, is accessible 24 hours a day throughout the year.



Historian's Corner

presented by the Northbrook Historical Society

Wayside Farm, the last self-sustaining family Northbrook farm, was located just outside the northern Village limits on Waukegan Road.

Today, instead of a farm, the Toll Road Spur, Red Roof Inn and other businesses occupy the land that was farmed for six generations by the Werhane Family. Louie Werhane, his wife Olive, and their two sons were the last to farm the fertile land.



A founding member of the Historical Society, Louie regaled the board with stories of growing up on the farm.

Once Waukegan Road was paved in 1921, Louie Werhane told of roller-skating to and from school while sharing the road with a car most days. Later, traffic increased enough that the family opened a vegetable stand near the road to sell their fresh farm produce to passing motorists.

As a young man, Louie was paid \$3 a week when he worked at a gas station on the southeast corner of Waukegan Road and County Line Road, now called Lake Cook Road. The gas station, pictured right, was beside the famous eatery, Phil Johnson's Restaurant. In 1933, he bought that gas station for \$300. Several years later, when much of the traffic moved east to the newly opened Skokie Boulevard he sold the business and went back to farming.

Gone are those simple days, the buildings and the people who populated them. Replaced instead with high-speed travel, new technologies and electronic gadgets then unknown nor dreamed of. So, next time you are sitting idling in traffic because of road construction at this corner, remember these photos of the way it "used to be." Then, ponder on what "used to be" Northbrook vistas your children will remember!
