Administrative Hearing Process Begins in Northbrook

Beginning in November, the Village will offer Administrative Hearings (or local adjudication) as an alternative to the County Circuit Court for municipal code violations.

Cases heard at an Administrative Hearing will include non-moving traffic violations (i.e. parking and vehicle sticker tickets); local ordinance violations (i.e. shoplifting and cannabis cases); nuisance and code enforcement cases; fire, building, and health code infractions; unlicensed businesses; water, sewer, and stormwater issues; as well as underage curfew, tobacco, and alcohol violations. State law violations, including moving violations, will continue to be resolved at the Circuit Court level.

By holding local Administrative Hearings, the Village will expedite timelines, provide a convenient and local opportunity for defendants to be heard, and reduce costs for all parties.

The first Administrative Hearing will take place November 15 in the Board Room at Village Hall. Hearings will take place on a monthly basis.





The EDC provides a continuing forum for sharing information about economic development to improve decision-making processes. In addition, the EDC promotes appropriate economic development policy implementation to benefit the community as a whole. For example, the critical services provided by the Village are funded primarily by sales tax generated from local businesses. A total of 35% of the Village's corporate fund is derived from sales tax. preceding page. This year marks the 25th anniversary of the creation of the Economic Development Committee (EDC). I applaud them for their continuing efforts to promote the Village of Northbrook.

Speaking of economic development, the Village Board recently heard a preliminary zoning application for the re-development of Northbrook Court. A proposal to tear down Macy's Department Store and build apartments, restaurants, and additional retail space was presented to the Board for initial comment. It now goes to both the Plan Commission and the Architectural Control Commission for review before coming back to the Board for a final decision. Two other pieces of legislation that the Board acted on:

Cook County Sick Leave Ordinance

Last month, the Board repealed an ordinance which exempted Northbrook businesses from the Cook County Sick Leave Ordinance which mandates that employers in Cook County provide each employee with one hour of sick leave for every 40 hours worked, up to 40 hours of paid sick leave per year, for employees who have worked at least 80 hours within a 120-day period. Effective January 1, 2019, all Northbrook businesses must comply with the Cook County ordinance.

Bicycle Helmet Requirement

Northbrook's new helmet law requires children under the age of 16 to wear bike helmets when riding in public. Concerns about the number of severe and fatal head injuries to children was brought to the attention of the Village Board during the "Hear from the Audience" portion at one of our bimonthly meetings in October. 

Northbrook Subsidized Taxi Program

The Village of Northbrook's Subsidized Taxicab Program was created to offer senior residents of incorporated Northbrook 55 years or older and permanently disabled Village of Northbrook residents an affordable transportation option in addition to what other agencies offer.

The program now utilizes an Electronic Swipe Card (ESC) to offset the cost of the metered fare. Each use of an ESC has a \$5 dollar value and each program participant

will be allowed up to 16 ride subsidies per month. ESCs are only accepted by American Taxi and 303 Taxi.

How to Apply for the Northbrook Subsidized Taxi Program

Applications for the program are available at Northbrook Village Hall (1225 Cedar Lane) or on the Village website at www.northbrook.il.us/Taxi

Proof of residency is required to participate in the program.

Once the application has been approved, the resident will receive an ESC and a brochure with further instructions on how to use the card.

When Winter Weather Heads Our Way, the Northbrook Public Works Department Will Be Ready!

The Village's snow removal operation begins with seven or more trucks spreading de-icing materials on main and secondary streets. As snow begins to accumulate, standby personnel are called in to plow the 539 lane miles of Village owned and maintained streets, municipal parking lots, and designated sidewalks.

Important Snow Plowing Fact...

After the snow stops, a complete plow-cycle can take at least 4-6 hours, depending on weather and traffic.

Help Our Public Works Crews: Keep Your Vehicles Off the Streets.

You can help Public Works crews clear our roadways as quickly as possible by keeping vehicles off the street during snow removal operations. The Village's number one concern is the safety of those using our streets.

Snow and ice control efforts give priority to higher traffic Village roadways, such as Walters Avenue, Cherry Lane, Pfingsten Road, Techny Road, and Shermer Road.

Arterial roads such as Lake-Cook, Dundee, Willow, Sanders, Landwehr, and Waukegan are plowed by either the Illinois Department of Transportation or the Cook County Highway Department.

Keep Plowed Snow out of Shoveled Driveways.

Residents can help keep their driveway clear by shoveling snow to the right side of their driveway (as viewed from the home, looking at the street). Please note: The Public Works Department does not clear private driveway entrances.

Move Your Vehicle After 2" of Snow.

When 2 or more inches of snow fall, it is illegal (by Village Ordinance) to park on Northbrook streets until plowing has been completed. If you park in the street, you may be ticketed and towed.

Holiday Refuse Collection Schedule and Cart Storage Reminders

During the week of Thanksgiving, pick-up for Thursday customers will be Friday and Friday customers will be Saturday.

The last chance for yard waste collection (without the subscription service) will be on your pick-up day during the week of Thanksgiving. If you have the subscription services, your pick-up will take place every other week.

Christmas trees will be collected during the month of January on your regular pick-up date. One tree per residence will be collected at the curb. Trees should be free of all lights, garland, tinsel, and decorations.

Free Holiday Refuse Collection

Extra household refuse will be collected on your pick-up day free of charge during two one-week periods; the week of December 24 and the week of December 31.

Bicycle Helmets Required for Children 16 and Under

Last month the Village passed an ordinance requiring the use of bicycle helmets by children under the age of 16 when riding a bicycle in public areas of the Village. The purpose of the bicycle helmet law is to reduce the number of severe and fatal head injuries to children involved in bicycle crashes. Bicycle helmets, when used properly, reduce head injuries and fatalities. Studies show that helmets reduced overall head injuries by about 60 percent and reduced fatalities by about 73 percent.



Northbrook's new helmet law is a significant way to increase helmet use, but as with all laws, its effectiveness is related to implementation. The practical effect of bicycle helmet laws is to encourage parents to require their children to use helmets (and educate parents to serve as role models and wear a helmet despite the lack of a law requiring adults to wear helmets). Most local bicycle shops will help you correctly size and fit your helmets.

Simple Recycling for Textile Recycling Begins in December

The free, year-round curbside textile collection begins the week of December 3. Simple Recycling will run the same holiday schedule as Advanced Disposal. Textiles collected by Simple Recycling are not tax deductible. Watch for the Simple Recycling mailers for more details.

A reminder regarding refuse and recycling cart storage:

Please ensure that your garbage receptacles are regularly stored behind the front face of your house or within the garage on non-pickup days. Carts should not be stored in the front of your property. Also, after collection, carts need to be returned to the storage location within twelve hours.

Properly Fitted Helmets Offer the Best Protection

All bicyclists, regardless of age, can help protect themselves by wearing properly fitted bicycle helmets every time they ride. Bicycle helmets meeting the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) or the American Society For Testing And Materials (ASTM) or the Snell Memorial Foundation, Inc., should be worn at all times when riding a bicycle, being carried on a bicycle, or transported in a bicycle trailer, on a street, alley, highway, sidewalk, or public path within the Village of Northbrook.

Insist on your child wearing a bike helmet at all times. Remember the concrete in your driveway is as hard as the concrete on major roads! Lastly, be a good role model – wear your helmet too!



Our Shermerville Men Who Gave Their Lives

Seventeen years after the Village of Shermerville was incorporated in 1901, the country was fighting two enormous battles putting our citizens in jeopardy.

One battle was taking place on the home front, as the Spanish flu ravaged across the land. The other battle was taking place across the sea, as our men and boys fought in WWI. Both battles touched our small town when two young Shermerville men gave their lives while serving the country.

George W. Benjamin, for whom the American Legion Post 791 is named, was killed in action on January 24, 1918 at De Coetquiean, France.

Theodore C. Werhane died as a result of the flu while in camp in San Antonio, Texas.

On successive Sundays in November, two events commemorating the end of WWI and the 117th Birthday of our Village will take place. See the front page for details about the Veteran's Day ceremony on Sunday, November 11 and the weekend open house at the George W. Benjamin American Legion Hall.
