Due to this month's upgrade, the Village is asking everyone to re-opt in to Northbrook Notify and take advantage of the new notification categories.

Over the past two years a crew of auto burglars has been very active in the Midwest.

Nicknamed the "Felony Lane Gang," they break car windows to steal purses and wallets, specifically targeting cars in parking lots of schools, day care centers, golf courses, parks, and exercise facilities. Often, they use the stolen checks and ID's to withdraw funds from the bank accounts of the victims.

Dundee Road Closing at RR Crossing for Repair – DETOUR

The Dundee Road Railroad Crossing by the Fire Department Headquarters will be closed to **all** through traffic from November 2-8 for crossing replacement. The repair work was coordinated with the halt of rail traffic due to the Shermer Road Railroad bridge reconstruction south of Willow Road. Detour signs will be posted. This week long disruption will provide long term benefits as the Dundee Road crossing is in great need of repair.

Question Regarding the Shermer Walters Triangle- Public Forum

The Village owned property just west of the tracks on Shermer and Walters, known as the Triangle, is designated as a public forum in Northbrook. The Village has established rules and guidelines governing the use of the Triangle. Civic groups may apply to the Village for a permit to place a sign or display on the Triangle for up to 30 days on a first-come, first-served basis. Displays and signage permitted on the Triangle include holiday decorations and religious displays, political message signs, memorial signs, and promotional signs for not-for-profit groups. Please note that messages displayed on the public forum are not endorsed by the Village, and no public funds or tax monies are used to erect or maintain signs or displays placed on the Triangle.

Update on the Nurses Club Lending Closet

Good news! The Park District is taking over the Northbrook Nurses Club Lending Closet. Beginning on November 11, the Northbrook Park District will operate the lending closet to supply medical equipment to the community. Northbrook residents will be able to borrow wheelchairs, walkers, canes, crutches and other assistive equipment for up to three months. The only charge will be a refundable deposit of \$25. The Senior Center staff will coordinate the program from the Leisure Center, located at 3323 Walters Avenue. Northbrook residents can schedule a time to pick up equipment after November 11 by calling the Senior Center at 847/291-2988.

Holiday Refuse Collection Schedule

During the week of Thanksgiving, pick-up for Thursday customers will be Friday and Friday customers will be Saturday. During the week of Christmas and New Year's, pick-up for Thursday and Friday customers will be delayed one day.

The last chance for yard waste collection will be during the week of Thanksgiving,

November 25 - 30, depending on your pick-up date.

Christmas trees will be collected during the month of January. One tree per residence will be collected at the curb. Trees should be free of all lights, garland, tinsel and decorations.

Just a reminder regarding refuse and recycling cart storage: Carts must be stored to the rear of the prime structure on your property, or within the garage. Carts cannot be stored in the front of your property. Also, after collection, carts need to be returned to the storage location within twelve hours.

Northbrook Dog Park at Coast Guard Park Opens Late November

The Northbrook Park District is building a dog park for the community to bring residents and their pets together to socialize.

The Northbrook Dog Park at Coast Guard Park, 2490 Dundee Road, just west of the Northbrook Post Office, is expected to open in late November. The Park District facility will be the only public area in Northbrook where dogs are allowed to run and play off-leash.

The Park District is developing the dog park in response to growing interest in the community, as expressed in surveys and public meetings.

Dog Park Features

- Completely fenced-in grounds
- Enclosed 2-acre area for all dogs
- Enclosed .5-acre area for small dogs
- Shelter
- Dog wash
- Tables and benches
- Drinking fountain
- Soft walking path
- Parking for 37 cars
- Lost and found box

Access to the dog park requires an annual membership, which allows unlimited use of the park during daylight hours.

Let it Snow!

Our Northbrook Public Works Department has been preparing for this winter's snow removal operations.

The Village's snow removal operation begins with seven or more trucks spreading de-icing materials on main and secondary streets. As snow begins to accumulate, standby personnel are called in to plow the 537 lane miles of Village owned and maintained streets, municipal parking lots and designated sidewalks.

Help Our Crews!

Keep Your Vehicles Off the Streets.

You can help Public Works crews clear our roadways as quickly as possible by keeping vehicles off the street during snow removal operations. The Village's number one concern is the safety of those using our streets.

Important Snow Plowing Facts...

A complete plow-cycle can take at least 6-7 hours depending on weather and traffic.

Thank you for your Patience!

Snow and ice control efforts give priority to higher traffic roadways such as Walters Avenue, Cherry Lane, Pfingsten Road, Techny Road, and Shermer Road.

Main roads such as Lake-Cook, Dundee, Willow, Sanders, Landwehr and Waukegan

are plowed by either the Illinois Department of Transportation or the Cook County Highway Department.

Keep plowed snow out of shoveled driveways.

Residents can help keep their driveway clear by shoveling snow to the right side of their driveway (as viewed from the home looking at the street). Please note: The Public Works Department does not clear private driveway entrances.

Move Your Vehicle After 2" of Snow

When 2 or more inches of snow fall, it is illegal (by Village Ordinance) to park on Northbrook streets until plowing has been

completed. If you park in the street you may be ticketed and towed.

If your vehicle has become disabled or if you would like to find out if the parking ban is in effect, please call the Police Department at 847/564-2060.

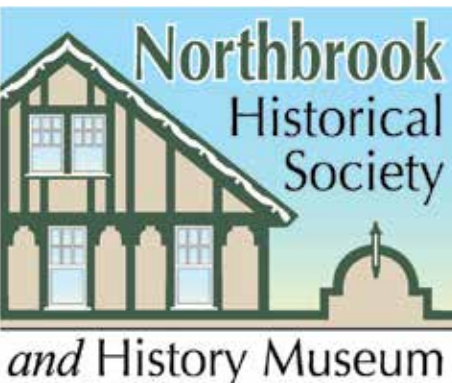

Recycling CFLs and Batteries and Small Electronics

Starting November 1, the drop off bins for recycling CFL's and batteries in the Village Hall lobby will be moved to the Village Fleet Maintenance Garage at 1227 Cedar Lane, right behind the Village Hall.

In addition, there will be a collection container for 4' fluorescent bulbs. Also moving to this location is the collection box for Recycling Avenue. Recycling Avenue, an agency which provides employment for adults with disabilities, recycles small electronics such as phones, modems and cameras.

The recycling bins, which are self-serve only, will be available during normal business hours, 7am to 3pm, Monday through

Friday. Please note that staff is not available to assist with depositing recyclables. These recycling bins will also be available during the first Tuesday of the month Electronics Collection events.

Battery Recycling

The Northbrook Public Library, at 1201 Cedar Lane, also provides a drop-off bin in the lobby for household batteries, only. The bin will be available during Library hours. Please, no car batteries (these can be picked up with regular garbage).

For Larger Electronics- Monthly Collections

Northbrook offers a drop-off opportunity for household electronics on the first Tuesday of every month from 8am to 3pm. The drop-off area is located at the Village Fleet Maintenance Garage behind the Village Hall. Please note, paint recycling drop off is on-hold until Tuesday, April 1.

Northbrook Maintains Class 7 Status with National Flood Insurance CRS

Once again, the Village has received good news from FEMA! Following the annual recertification review, the Village has maintained a Class 7 Rating with the National Flood Insurance Program's Community Rating System (CRS).

The CRS program allows communities to achieve certain credits (i.e. reduction in flood insurance policy premiums) by implementing specific floodplain outreach activities and development regulations. Currently, there are only 16 communities in Illinois with a Class 7 rating out of 56 participating communities in Illinois.

What Does This Mean for Village Residents?

Residents who live in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) continue to qualify for a 15% reduction on flood insurance and those who do not live in a SFHA area can qualify for a 5% reduction.

However, there are two cases where residents who have federally-backed flood insurance do not receive the CRS discount:

- If they have a Preferred Risk Policy (people outside the 100-yr. floodplain who never had a previous flood claim).

- The first floor of the structure is 1' or more below the Base Flood Elevation on a Post-FIRM building (non-compliant structure).

How Are Residents Notified?

All residents and business owners with properties located within a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) were notified by letters mailed in late September. In addition, this information is posted once a year in our September Village Newsletter.

Since Northbrook participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), a federal program that offers flood insurance which can be purchased through property and casualty insurance agents, rates are set and do not differ from company to company or agent to agent.

The Northbrook Historical Society Turns 40 in 2014

On Oct. 9, 1973, ten people showed up for a meeting to discuss the establishment of a historical society for Northbrook.

At the second meeting on Oct 25, the group elected a seven-member board, recruited additional interested people and sketched out a plan to accomplish the establishment of the Northbrook Historical Society. At that meeting they also learned that the Bartelme's Northfield Inn was available to them if they raised it and relocated the building.

Over the next few months the group worked to find a home for the building, hire an attorney and incorporate as a not-for-profit organization. On March 18, 1974, the Northbrook Historical Society became official when the Illinois Secretary of State issued a certificate of incorporation. Three days later, the certificate was filed with the Cook County Recorder of Deeds.

Other firsts and milestones occurred soon after. The first general meeting was held later in March 1974 and featured Louie Werhane talking about farming – Louie ran the last self-sustaining family farm just north of the village limits. The first annual meeting was held in May. Also within the year, the first Historical Society newsletter was delivered to members and benefits to raise funds were held. A building inspection affirmed the Northfield Inn's structural integrity. The Park District and the Historical Society formed a partnership and determined a suitable place to move the building and funds to move it were raised.



Finally, fifteen months and eight days after that first meeting, from the corner of Shermer and Waukegan roads the old Northfield Inn was rolled slowly down the hill and across the baseball diamond to its new home in the Village Green Park. Construction of the new basement began, the building moved onto its new foundation and interior restoration began.

On July 4, 1976, our country's bicentennial and the Village's 75th birthday celebration, the Northfield Inn opened to the public for the first time as the home of the Northbrook Historical Society and the Northbrook History Museum.
