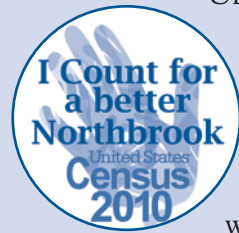

U.S. Census Forms Will Be in the Mail this Month
Fill Out Your U.S. Census Form and Mail it Back!*



The 2010 Census is a count of each person living in the United States and is mandated by the U.S. Constitution. The 2010 Census form will be one of the shortest in U.S. history, dating back to the first census in 1790. Consisting of just ten questions, and requiring about ten minutes to complete, the 2010 Census will ask just name, gender, age, race ethnicity, relationship and whether the head of household owns or rents their home. Strict confidentiality laws protect the respondents and the information they provide.

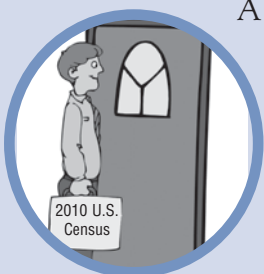
Census data are used to apportion Congressional seats to states, to distribute more than \$400 billion in federal funds to tribal, state and local governments each year and to make decisions about what community services to provide.



Participation Is Critical!

The key to this endeavor is having every household fill out and mail back a completed census form. Northbrook receives state and federal funds based on population. **A short count means that the Village will not receive its fair share of the funding.** Because our last population count was just below 35,000, the 2010 Census is especially important. A count of 35,000 or more makes Northbrook eligible to receive funds that are not available to communities with less than 35,000. This is why it's so important to "Strive for 35 - Population 35,000!"

A census questionnaire will be mailed to you. If you fill out the form and mail it back, no census taker will need to come to your residence. The Census Bureau would rather receive your form back in the mail, and you can help our country save money by not requiring a census taker to visit you in person. ❁

Are You Ready for "Earth Hour" on March 27 at 8:30pm?

Millions of people around the world will turn off their lights for one hour, Earth Hour-on March 27 at 8:30pm local time, to demonstrate how much energy can be saved with minimal effort. Everyone in Northbrook is encouraged to take part by committing to turn off all non-essential lighting. Sponsored by World Wildlife Fund, Earth Hour is the largest event of its kind in the world. In 2009, nearly one billion people from 4,100 cities in 87 countries turned out their lights, including some international landmarks such as the Golden Gate Bridge and the Eiffel Tower. New Energy Code Requirements for Single Family Homes

Special Workshop March 5

The State of Illinois recently adopted the 2009 edition of the International Energy Conservation Code (IECC), applicable for construction in all buildings, including construction in single family homes. Northbrook's Building and Development Department will hold a workshop on the New Energy Code Requirements for Single Family Homes for local architects and contractors. In addition to gaining valuable insights on the changes from the previous 2006 edition of the IECC, the workshop will highlight permit submittal requirements as well as what you can expect the Village inspector to look for when checking for conformance with the new requirements. Although the presentation will be geared toward professionals in the construction industry, anyone interested in the new energy code requirements for single family residential construction is welcome to attend. The workshop will be held at 8:00am on Friday, March 5, in the Board Room at the Northbrook Village Hall, 1225 Cedar Lane. ❁

Count for a Better Northbrook

While the economy continues to challenge local revenues, I ask everyone in Northbrook to help "Count for a Better Northbrook" by filling out their U.S. Census form. An accurate population count helps to determine how more than \$400 billion dollars of federal funding each year is spent on local infrastructure and services such as: public works projects, transportation, emergency services and schools. This month, every residence in Northbrook will receive an official U.S. Census form in the mail. I encourage everyone to participate by mailing back your easy 10-question form as soon as possible. Mailing back the completed form will not only make sure you "Count for a Better Northbrook," but it should also eliminate the need for a U.S. Census taker to come knocking on your door!

Last month, a special newsletter was distributed outlining the Comprehensive Plan: Northbrook's Vision for the Future. During the month of February, Village staff held five public forums and attended nine Village board and commission meetings to gather feedback from residents, businesses and property owners regarding their ideas and thoughts on the draft 2010 Village of Northbrook Comprehensive Plan. The Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee and Board of Trustees will be studying these comments and suggestions to determine which ideas should be incorporated into the Plan.

Upcoming Regional Construction Projects

This summer, the Illinois State Tollway Authority will be resurfacing the Edens Spur, adding sound walls in select locations (including Williamsburg subdivision and Cove School) and making bridge repairs. The Cook County Highway Department will be reconstructing/widening Lake-Cook Road between Pfingsten Road and Waukegan Road and patching pavement between Pfingsten Road and Wilmot Road later this year. You may have already noticed the advance utility relocation work that is underway at Pfingsten and Lake-Cook Roads. Also, Pfingsten Road, between Keystone and White Pine Drive, will be resurfaced this summer with federal stimulus funds. Staff is working with the various agencies to minimize traffic disruptions during the 2010 construction season. ❁

As part of Northbrook's commitment to its diverse and rich urban forest, our Forestry staff is constantly on the lookout for pests and diseases that may negatively affect your trees.

Our primary concerns are:



Emerald Ash Borer

Village conducts regular surveys to identify what pest may be causing ash tree decline and discern whether or not it may be Emerald Ash Borer (EAB).



Two Lined Chestnut Borer

Look for D-shaped holes on the trunks of your stressed oak trees.



Gypsy Moth

Check your trees for signs of tan-colored, tear-drop shaped egg masses on the bark.



Fungal Blights

Wet weather from last season is likely to cause fungal infestations on susceptible trees.

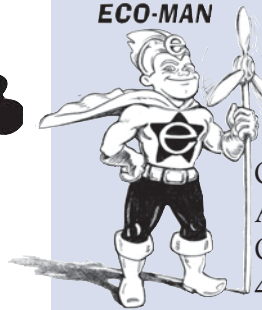

Storm Drainage Ditches on Your Property

If you have a storm drainage ditch on your property, please keep it clear of long grass, branches, debris and other vegetation. During the growing season, please regularly mow any vegetation growing in the drainage ditch. This will help keep the vegetation levels manageable and water flowing freely. If during wet weather the ditch becomes blocked and begins to overflow onto your property or the street, please call Public Works at 847 272-4711.

Spring is the Time for Home and Yard Improvements!

Please remember that permits are required for most home improvements, including landscaping, that involve changing ground elevation, driveways (permits are required if working on public-way or increasing the size), decks, patios, gazebos, storage sheds*, screened porches, emergency generators, basement finishes, new or replacement water heaters, furnaces, boilers or air conditioning condensing units, fences and all swimming pools over two feet in depth. Permits, which must be obtained before work begins, protect homeowners and ensure compliance with Village codes and ordinances. *Storage sheds 80 SF or less do not require Village permits, but zoning regulations still apply! Please check with the Zoning Administrator at 847 272-5050. ext. 4248, or visit our website to get the rules before installing your shed. ❁

Severe Weather Preparedness Week: March 1-6

Know the Terms Used to Describe a Tornado or Severe Thunderstorm Threat:

WATCH – A tornado or severe thunderstorm is possible. Watch the sky and listen to the radio or television for more information. Be prepared to take shelter.

WARNING – A tornado or severe thunderstorm has been sighted or indicated by weather radar. For a tornado or severe thunderstorm warning, take shelter immediately, turn on a battery-operated radio or television, and wait for the “all clear” announcement by authorities.

Every year lives are threatened or lost and property is destroyed by severe weather events.

There are a variety of severe weather hazards that affect Illinois, including thunderstorms and tornadoes.

Tornadoes pose the greatest severe weather risk to residents of Illinois. An average of 27 tornadoes occur in the state per year. Severe thunderstorms can also produce very damaging winds. They can cause significant structural damage to buildings, especially weaker structures, such as barns and outbuildings.

**If a tornado is sighted within 10 miles of Northbrook, the Outdoor Warning System will be activated!
You should hear the siren if you are outdoors.**

What You Should Know About the Outdoor Warning Siren System

Northbrook has a siren warning system installed throughout the community.

The system consists of a series of sirens strategically located and is intended to provide warning of impending danger. You may only hear the sirens if you are outside.

Warning System Activation

The system is designed to notify the community by **Alert Warning** and **Attack Warning** signals. The signals are standardized for outdoor warning devices by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

Alert Warning

An **Alert Warning** signal is a 3 to 5 minute steady siren. This signal is used during a severe weather emergency in the event of a tornado or funnel cloud sighting. The reporting area includes a ten-mile perimeter around the Village. The **Alert Warning** signal shall indicate to all persons to “immediately seek shelter, turn on your radio or television, and listen for essential emergency information.” *Please note, severe weather watches are reports of weather conditions in which tornadoes could occur. The warning system is not activated for severe weather watches.*

Attack Warning

An **Attack Warning** signal is a 3 to 5 minute wavering siren. This signal means that an actual attack against the United States has been detected and that the Federal Emergency Broadcast System has been activated. According to federal government guidelines, “this signal will be used for no other purpose and will have no other meaning.”

Reactivation

Once it is activated, the warning sirens will not be reactivated for the same incident. The warning sirens will be reactivated only for new, confirmed incidents.

All Clear

In keeping with established policies, the Village of Northbrook will not issue the all clear for any **Alert** or **Attack** signals. Please monitor commercial radio and television for further information.

Things to Remember!

- ⚡ Know the different signals.
- ⚡ Know what to do.
- ⚡ Have a battery-operated radio available.
- ⚡ Outdoor siren testing takes place the first Tuesday of every month at 10:00am. If severe weather appears imminent during the normal test time, the test will be postponed until the next day.

NOTE: There will be a statewide test of the Outdoor Alert System at 10am on Tuesday, March 2nd. ❁

Change Your Clocks, Change Your Batteries...

Along with the time change as we “Spring Forward” on Sunday, March 14, it is also smart to change your batteries in your smoke alarm and carbon monoxide detector. Also, it is important to note that your smoke alarms should be replaced every 8-10 years.



Did You Know that There Are Different Types of Smoke Alarms?

In the event of a fire, a smoke alarm can save your life and those of your loved ones. There are many different brands of smoke alarms available on the market but they fall under two basic types: ionization and photoelectric.

Ionization alarms sound more quickly when a flaming, fast moving fire occurs. **Photoelectric alarms** are quicker at sensing smoldering, smoky fires. **Dual sensor smoke alarms** combine ionization and photoelectric into one unit.



How Do I Keep My Smoke Alarm Working?

Smoke alarms with batteries: Smoke alarms powered by *long-lasting* batteries are designed to have the entire unit replaced according to manufacturer’s instructions. In *standard type* battery powered smoke alarms, the batteries need to be replaced at least once per year and the whole unit should be replaced every 8-10 years.

Hard-wired, battery back-up smoke alarms: The batteries need to be checked monthly, and replaced at least once per year. The entire unit should be replaced every 8-10 years.
