Severe Weather Preparedness

Every year lives are threatened or lost and property is destroyed by severe weather events.

There are a variety of severe weather hazards that affect Illinois, including thunderstorms and tornadoes. Tornadoes pose the greatest severe weather risk in Illinois. An average of 27 tornadoes occur in the state every year. Severe thunderstorms can also produce damaging winds, which can cause significant structural damage to buildings. It's important for you and your family to be informed and ready.

March 3-9 is *Severe Weather Preparedness Week* in Illinois. Learn how to prepare your family before a disaster strikes. Do you know the difference between a Watch and a Warning? Do you have a battery operated radio? Have you registered your contact information with Northbrook Notify? Please see page 2 for important information about preparedness including details about the Outdoor Warning Siren System and suggestions for weather monitoring.

Consolidated General Election Information

Register to Vote by March 12 for the April 9th Election

If you change your name or move, even within the Village, you must update your voter registration or you can be turned away at the polling place. If you wish to check your registration, call 312/603-5656 or go on-line at www.cookcountyclerk.com

There are four convenient methods of registering to vote:

- Register at the Village Hall by March 12
- Apply online by March 12
- Call for an application - due March 12
- Register and vote in-person during Grace-period Registration from March 13 to April 6.

March 3-9 is Severe Weather Preparedness Week – Be Informed and Be Prepared

Every year lives are threatened or lost and property is destroyed by severe weather events.

Know the Terms Used to Describe a Tornado or Severe Thunderstorm Threat:

- **WATCH** – A tornado or severe thunderstorm is possible. Watch the sky and listen to the radio or television for more information. Be prepared to take shelter. Please note, severe weather watches are reports of weather conditions in which tornadoes could occur. The warning system is not activated for severe weather watches.
- **WARNING** – A tornado or severe thunderstorm has been sighted or indicated by weather radar. For a tornado or severe thunderstorm warning, take shelter immediately, turn on a battery-operated radio or television, and wait for the “all clear” announcement by authorities.

What You Should Know About the Outdoor Warning Siren System

Northbrook has an outdoor siren warning system installed throughout the community. The system consists of a series of sirens strategically located and is intended to provide warning of impending danger. The primary purpose of the warning sirens is to notify individuals who are outdoors at the time of the weather threat. You may not hear them inside your home or business.

- **Warning System Activation**
The system is designed to notify the community by Alert Warning and Attack Warning signals. The signals are standardized for outdoor warning devices by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.
 - › **Alert Warning**

An Alert Warning signal is a 3 to 5 minute steady siren. This signal is used in the event of a tornado or funnel cloud sighting. The reporting area includes a ten-mile perimeter around the Village. The Alert Warning signal shall indicate to all persons to “immediately seek shelter, turn on your radio or television, and listen for essential emergency information.”

- › **Attack Warning**
An Attack Warning signal is a 3 to 5 minute wavering siren. This signal means that an actual attack against the United States has been detected and that the Federal Emergency Broadcast System has been activated.



- › **Reactivation**
Once it is activated, the warning sirens will not be reactivated for the same incident. The warning sirens will be reactivated only for new, confirmed incidents.
- › **All Clear**
- › The Village of Northbrook will not issue the all clear announcement for any Alert or Attack signals. Please monitor commercial radio and television for further information as well as the Village website a www.northbrook.il.us.

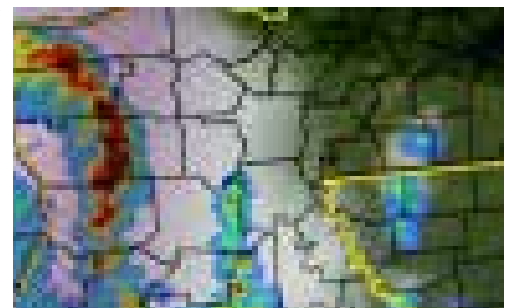
Things to Remember!

- Know the different signals and know what to do.
- Look for the following danger signs:
 - › Dark, often greenish sky
 - › Large hail
 - › A large, dark, low-lying cloud (particularly if rotating)
 - › Loud roar, similar to a freight train.
- If you see approaching storms or any of the danger signs, be prepared to take shelter immediately.
- Visit www.ready.gov to learn more about how to prepare, plan and stay informed.

Signs of spring also remind us to do some spring-cleaning and with Earth and Arbor Day just a month away, now is a good time to start gathering recyclables to get ready for the special recycling event on Saturday, April 20. Local Development Projects

Construction continues to move forward on the independent senior housing project called The Lodge, located near the intersection of Founders and Kamp Drives. Also, by the time you receive this newsletter, construction may have begun on the North Shore Place assisted living facility located on the southwest corner of Sunset Ridge Road and Skokie Boulevard, behind Barnaby's.

At the writing of this newsletter, the Village has yet to receive formal applications for the proposed mixed-use development project on the northwest corner of Dundee Road and Skokie Boulevard, including the Mariano's Grocery Store, or for the proposed Wal-Mart further south along Skokie Boulevard. Lake Cook & Waukegan Road Intersection

The Cook County Highway Department will begin reconstruction of the intersection at Lake Cook and Waukegan roads beginning in late April. The roadwork is expected to be completed by the end of October 2013. For more information regarding the project visit www.lakecookroad.com. Status of the Shermer Road Rail Bridge Reconstruction

We remain focused on the status of the reconstruction of the Union Pacific rail bridge on Shermer Road. Staff has been working with all parties, including the UP, IDOT, the ICC and the Village of Glenview, to see that the design of the bridge is finalized and meets requirements for construction. The UP has committed to having the bridge and roadway open to vehicular traffic within the original 24-month timeline (by September 30, 2014), but we are working toward getting all construction completed ahead of that time. Fabrication of the bridge structure will begin this spring and we expect construction to begin in early fall 2013. Skunks Around Northbrook

The Proper Approach to "Orphaned" Wildlife

Spring is a time to remember that wild animals belong in the wild. Too often, well-meaning people pick up animals, particularly deer fawns and young birds, mistakenly believing that these animals have been abandoned. This is almost never the case. The parent animals are nearby, waiting for the human threat to leave, so that they may resume caring for their offspring. The best advice is: "If you care, leave them there!". Has your Home Been Tested for Radon?

Radon is the Nation's second leading cause of lung cancer after cigarette smoking

The Cook County Radon Awareness Program encourages residents to test their home for radon, a naturally occurring radioactive gas that can seep into a house through cracks in the basement floor and walls, around the openings of the sump pump or through crawl spaces. It's easy to test for radon and it's simple to fix your home, if necessary.

Radon Test kits can be ordered for \$7 through the Cook County Department of Environmental Control. The only way to know if you have radon in your home is by testing. Should a home have high radon, the names of licensed mitigators who specialize in radon reduction can be provided. Electric Aggregation

Northbrook Residents Continue to See Savings on their Electric Bills

Northbrook, along with the seven other communities that make up the North Shore Electricity Aggregation Consortium (Deerfield, Glencoe, Highland Park, Lake Bluff, Lake Forest, Park Ridge and Skokie) entered into a contract with MC Squared (mc2) after a competitive bid process, locking in a rate of 4.836 cents per kWh through May of 2013.

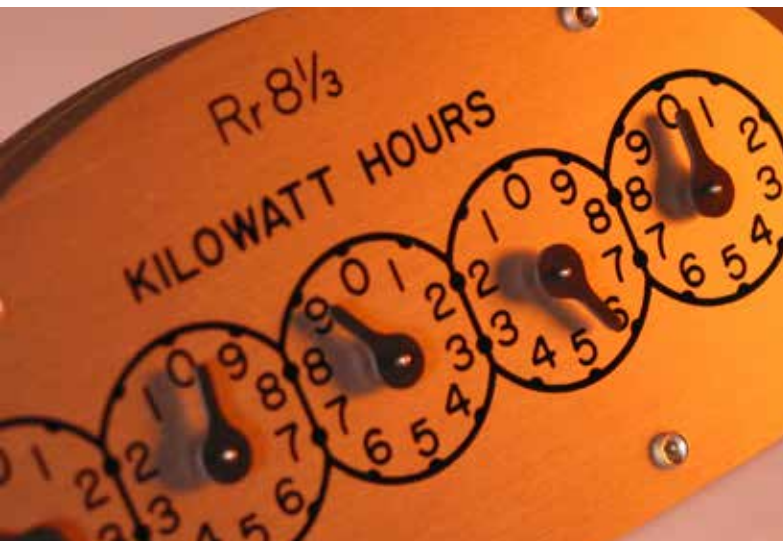
Because of electric aggregation, Northbrook residents will save approximately \$414 in the first 12 months of the program.

Comparing ComEd's current rate to the Consortium's Supply Rate, Northbrook customers are anticipated to save over \$4.6 million with each resident, on average, saving approximately \$414 from the period of June/July 2012 through May 2013.

If you are a new resident, you do need to enroll with mc2.

In order to enroll, you need to have an active ComEd account number. You can enroll by calling 888/808-7731, or you can opt in online at www.northshoreelectricityaggregation.com. Current customers can also use the website to enroll in the 100% Green Power Program.

For businesses that do not meet the "Small Business" definition provided by the State (Small business customers are defined as those that consume 15,000 kWh or less annually), you can receive a customized quote from mc2 by visiting www.mc2energyservices.com/business_options.php or you can learn about, and compare rates from, certified suppliers in the State of Illinois by visiting Plug In Illinois®, www.pluginillinois.org, the official electric choice website of the Illinois Commerce Commission.

Register to Vote for the April 9th Election

Make sure you are registered to vote. Remember, if you change your name or move, even within the Village, you must update your registration.

Register at the Village Hall

The Northbrook Village Hall will be open for voter registration Monday through Friday, 8:30am to 4:30pm, from now until March 12. You must provide two forms of identification – one showing your address and the other must be a state identification with photo.

Apply Online

You can also apply online to register to vote by using an online application provided by the Illinois State Board of Elections. You must have a printer or provide an email to complete your online application. www.elections.il.gov/InfoForVoters

Call for an Application

The Cook County Clerk's office can also mail you an application form. Call 312/603-0906 to request one. First-time voters who register by mail no longer have to vote in person the first time they vote. They can either vote in person or vote absentee by mail.

Grace-period Registration: March 13 – April 6

There is only one way and one place to register during grace period registration. Grace period registration and voting is conducted only at the Clerk's downtown office: 69 W. Washington, 5th Floor, Chicago. (You must vote the same time you register.)

Storm Drainage Ditches on Your Property

If you have a storm drainage ditch on your property, please keep it clear of long grass, branches, debris and other vegetation.

During the growing season, please regularly mow any vegetation growing in the drainage ditch. This will help keep the vegetation levels manageable and water flowing freely. If during wet weather the ditch becomes blocked and begins to overflow onto your property or the street, please call the Northbrook Public Works Department at 847/272-4711.

Historian's Corner presented by the Northbrook Historical Society

At the corner of Dundee and Sanders Roads is the Aux Plaine Cemetery. This pioneer cemetery contains the remains of some of our earliest settlers.

Hidden in plain sight for generations, this piece of untilled prairie looked nothing like what it was, a cemetery. For many years, the abandoned graveyard had been neglected. Decades ago, it was used as a garden space, a chicken yard and a pigpen; still later, it was overgrown and became a dumping ground for years of urban trash.

Once the Chase Bank was constructed in 2011, no observer would know a cemetery exists under the narrow strip of lawn alongside Dundee Road. The Village and

the Historical Society knew of its existence because of sparse documentation including a plot of survey from 1937 showing a few remaining gravestones. Also, the oral history and written recollections of the descendants of the early pioneers provided compelling evidence of its existence. Alvin Kiest supplied one of those early recollections when he wrote, "I remember the old church across the street with the cemetery in the back, many graves that had no stone and perhaps were never found."

Those graves were found on May 9, 2007 when the new owners of the property documented the existence of the cemetery and protected it during construction. The owners agreed to commemorate the cemetery with a historic marker, asked the Historical Society to provide the wording for the marker, and shared in its cost with the Village.

Finally, on a cold day in February 2013, six years after the archeologist confirmed the existence of the cemetery, a granite marker was placed on the site honoring the pioneers laid to rest more than 150 years ago.

Thanks to many, these founders are now recognized and honored.
