## Crime Prevention is the Best Defense

### Review the following crime prevention safety tips to familiarize yourself with ways to help prevent crimes of opportunity.

- Always lock doors, windows and set the home alarm, if you have one, before leaving the house. Always lock deadbolt locks.
- If you have an attached garage, be sure to lock the inside door between your garage and house. If you have a detached garage, keep it secured.
- Lock your car doors while at home, even if cars are stored inside your garage or parked in the driveway.
- Keep your garage door closed.
- Remove valuables from vehicles.
- Install secure window well covers.

- If you have double-hung or sliding windows or doors, place a wooden rod or stick in the track.
- Use timers for your lights if you come home after dark.
- If you are going on vacation, be sure to stop mail service and cancel newspapers so they do not pile up in front of your home while you are away.
- Be on the lookout and report suspicious vehicles that look out of place. Remember, burglars can be male or female, young or old and drive any type of vehicle.

Northbrook remains a very safe community, and we all must work together to keep it that way.

Call 911 immediately with details, descriptions and plate numbers if you see:

- Any suspicious vehicles driving slowly or repetitively through your neighborhood.
- Observe someone at a neighbor's front door, then see them walking to the side or rear of the house.
- Someone rings your doorbell, "by mistake." Burglars never just break in - they always ring the bell to see if anyone is home.

## Northbrook Maintains Class 7 Status with National Flood Insurance Program

Once again, the Village has received good news from FEMA! Following the annual recertification review, the Village has maintained a Class 7 Rating with the National Flood Insurance Program's Community Rating System (CRS).

The CRS program allows communities to achieve certain credits (i.e. reduction in flood insurance policy premiums) by implementing specific floodplain outreach activities and development regulations. Currently, there are only 14 communities in Illinois with a Class 7 rating out of 57 participating communities in Illinois.

### What Does this Mean for Village Residents?

Residents who live in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) continue to qualify for a 15% reduction on flood insurance and those who do not live in a SFHA area can qualify for a 5% reduction.

However, there are two cases where residents who have federally-backed flood insurance do not receive the CRS discount:

- If they have a Preferred Risk Policy (people outside the 100-yr. floodplain who never had a previous flood claim).
- The first floor of the structure is 1' or more below the Base Flood Elevation on a Post-FIRM building (non-compliant structure).

### How are Residents Notified?

All residents and business owners with properties located within a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) were notified by letters mailed in late January.

In addition, this information is posted annually in the Village Newsletter.

Since Northbrook participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), a federal program that offers flood insurance which can be purchased through property and casualty insurance agents, rates are set and do not differ from company to company or agent to agent.

Early Voting will be available at the Northbrook Village Hall starting March 23 through April 4. If you change your name or move, even within the Village, you must be registered to vote from the address where you are living or you can be turned away at the polling place.

The Village Hall is open for voter registration from 8:30am to 4:30pm, Monday-Friday. You also must display two pieces of identification. Neither needs to be a photo ID, but one must include your current address.

# Notes from Village President Sandy Frum



It was about 20 years ago when the Village of Northbrook first had a presence on the Internet with a webpage sponsored by the North Suburban Library System. The page included basic information, such as the data listed on the back page of this newsletter. As many of you may know, the Village of Northbrook has a very dynamic website, with pages and pages of information including everything from the latest news, meetings and events, to interactive applications and links to a world of knowledge of interest to Northbrook residents and businesses.

I thought it would be interesting to note that in 2014, the Village had over 500,000 page views on our website, with a total of over 140,000 unique visits. Some of the more popular pages visited include: recycling and scavenger service information, permits, employment, commuter parking, seasonal topics such as Trick or Treat hours and voting information, and local dining options.

## Mapping Features on our Website

Over the past few weeks, I've been exploring some of the new mapping features available. Last month's issue of the newsletter announced the new interactive map on the website which highlights new businesses and developments under construction in the Village. The site, [www.northbrook.il.us/ongoing-projects](http://www.northbrook.il.us/ongoing-projects) is worth visiting to learn more about major residential and development projects going on in our Village.

The mapping program on the website, MapOffice™, differs from commercial mapping sites, such as Google™ maps or MapQuest™, because it is an interactive Geographic Information System (GIS) application that provides property information and mapping tasks to the general public. The primary function of MapOffice™ is to enable visitors to perform property searches, either by address or Property Identification Number (PIN), and answer questions about a specific property, such as what school district it is in, if it is on or near a flood plain, and the zoning for the property, not to mention some wonderful aerial views. One of the useful tools on MapOffice is the Measure Distance Tool. If you like to take walks or ride your bike, the tool makes it easy to navigate a route in your neighborhood, or the area, and determine the exact distance of your route whether it is up and down your neighborhood streets or around the Village. The distance is measured in miles and feet.

## 2015/16 Village Budget

The Village's Fiscal Year begins May 1, 2015. Next month's newsletter will include specific dates and times for the Village Board budget review meetings to discuss the FY15/16 draft budget. Mr. Haley, an educator by profession, used the baseball diamond as an open-air classroom to teach leadership skills, teamwork and self-discipline to his players. From a modest beginning of just one team in 1971, JRW is now one of the most outstanding community organizations in Chicago. In April 2006, JRW registered 450 children into its Little League program and continues the tradition of service to the community.

# 2015 Parkway Tree Order Form

## The Village is offering the cost sharing Parkway Tree Planting Program to residents again this year.

New trees will be 2-diameter-inches or about 8 feet tall. A property owner's cost share will be \$175 per tree ordered, regardless of variety or size. Multiple trees may be ordered, providing there is adequate room within the public parkway area. Sorry, no trees may be ordered for private property.

The trees will be scheduled for planting during the month of May, as weather permits.

### Limitations

Trees must be planted:

- Equidistant from curb and sidewalks, typically at least 35' from other parkway trees
- At least 10' from a driveway or street light
- At least 45' from an intersection to ensure unobstructed sight lines
- At least 5' from manholes, fire hydrants and b-boxes

Note: Trees cannot be planted in the same spot as a recently removed parkway tree due to old root mass.

Ten species of trees are currently available. All trees are limited quantities on a first come, first serve basis. All trees may be viewed at [www.northbrook.il.us/ParkwayTree](http://www.northbrook.il.us/ParkwayTree).

Orders must be submitted by March 13, 2015.

### Please note:

- The Village makes final determination on planting location.
- Orders are processed on a first come, first serve basis.
- Trees may not be refused, moved or exchanged for any reason.

## Sunset Memorial Lawns - Northbrook Connections to Black History Month

The African American Civil War Memorial in Washington, D.C., commemorates the service of 209,145 African-American soldiers and sailors who fought for the Union in the Civil War. Charles Fritz, a 37 year-old farmer born in Tennessee, and Daniel York, a 29 year-old barber born in Illinois, are two of the men listed on the monument. Both are listed in the rolls of the 29th Regiment U.S. Colored Infantry and credited as serving from Northfield Township. Additional notes in Charles Fritz's military file from the National Archives say: "Not taken upon rolls of regiment." What little information we know about these two men comes from their military files.

Northbrook does have an important place in Chicagoland history that should be celebrated when local Black history is discussed. For many years, there were

few places where people of color could be laid to rest. By 1924, one of those places was here, outside of the village limits. The large, active cemetery is on the west side of Shermer Road near the intersection of Old Willow Road.



Sunset Memorial Gardens was listed in the 1952 Glenview/Northbrook telephone directory with a Glenview phone number. The address at that time was listed as: "Old Willow Road." Additional directions listed: "NW of Airbase-Shermer and Old Willow roads."

Today, it is called Sunset Memorial Lawns and contains sections exclusively for Jewish burials. Unfortunately, it is the only cemetery in Northbrook for which the Historical Society does not have burial information from the cemetery operators. However, one of our researchers has created a spreadsheet containing burials prior to 2011 and has posted photos of the majority of graves on the Find A Grave website. While it is no longer exclusively a Black cemetery, Sunset Lawns is the final resting place for thousands of men, women and children whose lives and stories we celebrate during Black History Month.
