Automated Water Meter Project

The Village of Northbrook continues to move forward with the installation of new meters that began in April 2025. As of Wednesday, January 21, 2026, a total of 11,293 of the 12,203-meter replacements have been installed or are currently scheduled to be replaced over the coming weeks. Customers who have not scheduled their meter replacements yet are encouraged to do so as soon as possible to avoid disruption to their water service. Ongoing Sanitary Sewer Cleaning for FY25-26

Sanitary sewer cleaning for FY25–26 is ongoing and is being performed by Public Works crews using high-velocity water to clean the interior walls of sanitary sewer pipes and remove accumulated grease, debris, and sediment. No chemicals are used in this process. As of the week of January 22, approximately 112,450 linear feet of sanitary sewer have been cleaned for FY25-26.

In-House Parkway Tree Trimming and Tree Removal Work Continues

During the month of January, Public Works continued in-house tree trimming and removal operations that began in early October 2025. To date, crews have trimmed 155 of 175 parkway trees in response to resident requests and have removed 71 of 89 parkway trees identified as dead, diseased, or posing a public safety risk. The remaining parkway trees scheduled for trimming or removal are anticipated to be completed by mid-March. The Village's contractor, Advanced Tree Care, Inc., will remove the stumps from trees removed by Public Works crews. Stump removal is anticipated to occur in May.
