Public Safety Community Engagement

Fleet Maintenance Garage Adaptive Reuse Project

On January 27, 2026, a ceremonial swinging of the sledgehammer was held to kick off construction of the new Fleet Maintenance Garage at 3504 Commercial Avenue. The event included a review of the project history and the work of a cross-departmental team of Village employees along with FGM Architects and Leopardo Construction to identify the option of an adaptive reuse project to meet facility space needs. The Village Board's commitment to replacing the current 1950s facility was recognized by staff as well.

The Fleet Maintenance Garage is designed to support the Village's day-to-day operations while providing a safe, welcoming workplace for employees and visitors where more than 325 municipal vehicles and power equipment are maintained, ranging from ambulances to woodchippers and operates around the clock to ensure Northbrook's essential services and public safety continue uninterrupted. Construction is expected to be completed in December 2026.
