**Sales Tax Monthly Report**

Click to review the Village's [monthly sales tax data](#) for collections through November 2025 (distributed to the Village in February 2026). The taxes collected are \$1,820,956 which is \$149,034 or 9% greater than the amount collected in February 2025 (for November 2024). This sales tax amount includes the 1% municipal, 1% home rule, and 3% local cannabis taxes.

## **Business License Updates**

This week, business license applications are being distributed electronically to applicants, with an option to pay online. Completed applications and payments are due by March 11, 2026.

## **New Public Works Fleet Maintenance Garage Update**

Interior demolition at the new Fleet Maintenance Garage adaptive reuse project at 3504 Commercial Ave. continues. Earthwork is expected to begin in the coming weeks to include excavation, grading, and soil preparation for installation of the storm trap detention system.

## **New Fire Station 11 Update**

Efforts continued this week with site preparation for the new Fire Station 11 at 820 Dundee Rd., to include the installation of construction fencing. Once the construction fence with screening is installed, the existing wooden fence along the eastern boundary of the property will be removed.

## **Automated Water Meter Project**

As of Friday, February 12, 2026, a total of 11,153 of the 12,203-meter replacements have been installed or are currently scheduled to be replaced. The Village has launched WaterSmart, a free online portal, that lets residents and businesses track water use, set high-bill alerts, and access personalized water-saving tips. ## **FY 25-26 Sewer Televising Update**

The Village's contractor is currently televising 35,903 linear feet of sanitary sewer. To date, approximately 19,415 linear feet (54%) have been completed. This work is expected to be completed by February 20, weather permitting.

## **Contractual Parkway Tree Trimming Begins the Week of February 23**

The Village's parkway tree trimming contractor is scheduled to begin trimming approximately 2,052 parkway trees in the central portion of the Village the week of February 23. This tree trimming work is expected to take approximately two weeks to complete.

## **Ongoing Sanitary Sewer Cleaning for FY25-26**

Sanitary sewer cleaning is ongoing and is being performed by Public Works crews using high-velocity water to clean the interior walls of sanitary sewer pipes. No chemicals are used in this process. Approximately 92,741 linear feet of sanitary sewer has been cleaned.

## **Public Safety Community Relations**

A class from Greenbriar School toured the Police Department, learning about officers' roles and department operations. Department staff toured the Park District Leisure Center to provide security input. Department representatives presented an Identity Theft and Prevention Program for the Women Enjoying Life group at Covenant Church, offering guidance on fraud awareness and prevention.
