### **Early Voting at Village Hall**

Voting at Northbrook Village Hall and other Cook County early voting centers will be March 17 through March 31. You can register to vote at ALL Early Voting Sites. Any voter who needs to register for the first time or file an address change must present two forms of ID, one of which shows the voter's current address. ### **Automated Water Meter Project**

In the coming weeks, residents and businesses will be receiving a letter from the Village and Veregy that introduces the Automated Water Meter project and provides information on what customers can expect in the coming months. Following the initial letter, Veregy will be mailing postcards to notify customers to schedule their meter replacement. Meter replacements can only be scheduled after a postcard is received. ## **Nicor Gas Main Replacement Installation**


Next week, Nicor intends to remove and re-pour the concrete of the inner northbound lane of Shermer Road. They will continue replacing the brickwork in the intersection of Meadow Road and Shermer Road, working one lane at a time. Additionally, on Friday, March 21, Nicor intends to remove and pour the next section of roadway in front of the West Metra Lot entrance. During this work, northbound and southbound traffic on Shermer Road will be reduced to a single lane in each direction.

## **Pothole Patching - Village Wide Progress**

Since November 2024, the Village has successfully patched 7,069 potholes as part of ongoing roadway maintenance efforts. We anticipate completing our second full cycle of pothole patching by the end of March. Pothole patching is a vital part of maintaining safe and efficient roadways in our community.

## Northbrook Downtown Streetscape and Infrastructure Improvements

Construction of the Northbrook Downtown Infrastructure and Streetscape Enhancements will start on Monday, March 17. Work will begin on Meadow Road north of Shermer Road with the installation of the ADA compliant parking and associated utility work.

## Spring 2025 Street Sweeping

The Village will begin its Spring 2025 street sweeping program by the end of March. This essential service plays a crucial role in maintaining clean and safe roadways throughout the community. Street sweeping removes debris, leaves, and other materials that accumulate over the winter months, improving the overall appearance of our streets. In addition to enhancing cleanliness, street sweeping is vital for stormwater management. By clearing debris that can clog storm sewer inlets, this process helps reduce the risk of localized flooding during spring rains. Regular sweeping also minimizes pollutants that could otherwise enter our waterways, supporting environmental sustainability. We appreciate residents' cooperation in keeping streets clear of parked vehicles during scheduled sweeping times to ensure crews can effectively clean curb lines. ## Storm Sewer Inlet Cleaning Progress

The Village has successfully completed 86% of storm sewer inlet cleaning for Fiscal Year 2024-2025. Public Works shares that regular maintenance of storm sewer inlets is essential to keeping our drainage system functioning properly, especially during heavy rainfall. Clearing debris, leaves, and sediment from inlets helps prevent neighborhood flooding, reduces strain on the stormwater system, and improves overall water quality by preventing pollutants from entering local waterways.
