Learn How to be *All-In* at home with the new Composting Video:

The Village, through the franchise agreement with LRS, has launched its new All-In Composting Program which allows residents to combine yard waste and food scraps into a single bin for regular collection on Wednesdays, all year long. [Watch this video to learn more how to be All In at your home!](#) The Village also wants to educate the public on the importance of composting for many reasons including:

- By keeping food scraps and yard waste out of the landfill, we conserve vital space so landfills won't fill up as fast (and overtime reduce landfill charges which are part of trash collection costs)
- Composting turns food scraps and yard waste into a healthy soil amendment
- It reduces greenhouse gas emissions (a potent greenhouse gas) which is produced when food scraps are placed in a landfill – but minimized when composted

Northbrook's new year-round *All-In* composting service allows residents to dispose of

the items in their composting cart such as food scraps (fruits, vegetables, shells and bones, pasta/rice, eggshells, nutshells, bread and grains, meat, fish, dairy, coffee grounds) and plants, flowers, and other yard waste. Similar to recycling carts which were introduced to all resident in order to separate items such as glass and plastic from the landfill years ago, changing our habits of what we throw in the trash, versus what we recycle, and what we composted will require effort on everyone's part. We hope the new video shows some ideas of how to make it easy for everyone to make the change.

Citizens Police Academy:

Congratulations to the 14 students that participated in the Spring 2025 Citizens Police Academy, successfully completing the 9-week program and graduated this week. The program led by Northbrook Police Community Relations Unit Supervisor Rich Rash and the supported by the Community Engagement Officer Amanda Jaegers and taught by sworn staff to inform and educate residents about the complex workings of the Police Department and policework.

National Prescription Take Back Day:
