Northbrook Downtown Infrastructure Improvements and Streetscape Enhancements

The Village's contractor, Leopardo Construction has continued to make significant progress this week on the Downtown Infrastructure Improvements and Streetscape Enhancements, despite being hampered by several days of rain. Trees and landscaping were installed along Shermer Road, stamped/colored concrete was installed at the intersection of Walters Avenue and Meadow Road, and the first of four crosswalks have been completed at the intersection of Shermer Road and Meadow Road. Brick seat walls have been constructed and are awaiting stone capes.

The corners at the intersection of Meadow Road and Shermer Road will be reinstated with temporary concrete in advance of the Memorial Day holiday and while the Village is awaiting the delivery of security/crash bollards. Once those are received the temporary concrete will be removed and permanent stamped/colored concrete will be installed. Following the Memorial Day holiday the final stamped and colored concrete will be completed when tree grates for the south side of Shermer Road, as well as the installation of the refurbished streetlights, and lighted pedestrian bollards. Additionally, concrete planters will be installed following the Memorial Day holiday.



Shermer Road Corridor Improvements

This week the contractor completed cutting for the medians, completed median removals, and started on the framing of the median curb & gutter. During the next week, the contractor will complete framing and pouring curb & gutter in the medians, complete preparatory work for pavement patching, and begin placing topsoil in medians. Next week, the contractor intends to continue work on Shermer Road. Work is expected to include cutting and removing the concrete medians. To learn more about this project, [click here](#).

Memorial Day Parade Preparation

The Public Works Department continued preparing for the Memorial Day holiday on Monday, May 26. This included installing American flags on streetlights, preparing landscaping and working with the Police Department for public safety and traffic control in advance of Memorial Day parade. In addition to these efforts, crews are performing pothole patching and sidewalk grinding along the parade route to enhance safety and appearance. A full street sweeping of the Central Business District and parade route is scheduled for Friday, May 23. Public Works vehicles will be cleaned and strategically positioned to block streets along the route, helping to ensure a smooth and secure celebration for all attendees.

Memorial Parade Honor Guard

The newly revived Honor Guard teams from Northbrook Police and Fire will be participating at the Memorial Day Parade for the first time, starting a new honorable tradition.

Cook County Roadway Construction Projects

As of Thursday, April 10 the Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways has begun resurfacing work for the three projects within the Village.

Project Locations and Updates:

- ***Landwehr Road (Hampton Court in Glenview to Dundee Road)***
 - Completed work for this location includes installation of inlet filters, sidewalk saw cuts, and silt fence installation.
 - Next week, the County anticipates continuing sidewalk construction and resurfacing work. Pavement milling has begun at Dundee intersection heading south, milling will continue through next week. The County is anticipated to start placing asphalt binder course late next week.
- ***Sunset Ridge Road (Lake Avenue in Glenview to Skokie Boulevard)***
 - Completed work for this location includes installation of inlet filters, sidewalk saw cuts, silt fence installation, storm sewer work, and pavement milling.
 - Next week, the County anticipates continuing sidewalk construction and resurfacing work.
- ***Walters Road (Landwehr Road to Pfingsten Road)***
 - Completed work for this location includes installation of inlet filters, sidewalk saw cuts, silt fence installation, storm sewer work, and pavement milling. In addition, asphalt binder course has been placed and completed.
 - Next week, the County anticipates continuing sidewalk construction and resurfacing work. They anticipate started placing asphalt surface course late next week.

Memorial Tree Replacement at Cannon Park

Public Works will be replacing a memorial Redbud tree, originally planted in 2017 in honor of Christina Jacobs, the late daughter of Plan Commissioner Norm Jacobs who passed away from cancer. The deceased tree is anticipated to be removed during the week of May 26, with a new Redbud to be planted during the first week of June. The replacement tree will once again be a Redbud.

Automated Water Meter Project

The Village of Northbrook has reached 15% of the meters being installed since work began on April 22. As of Thursday, May 25, 1,985 replacement meters have been installed. Those meters that have been installed are identified on the map below. For next week, the week of May 27, 608 replacements have been scheduled and in total almost 4,200 of the 12,203-meter replacements are currently scheduled over the coming weeks or have been installed. Postcards have been mailed to customers in Billing Zone 1 and 2 and a portion of Billing Zone 3. These postcards outline the necessary steps to schedule an appointment for their meter to be replaced. Meter replacements can be scheduled after a customer receives a postcard. Meter replacement appointments are scheduled in 2-hour windows but take approximately 30 minutes to complete. Central Business District Seasonal Set-Up

Last week, the Public Works Department completed the installation of benches and flower planters along Shermer Road as part of the Village's Central Business District Spring setup. This seasonal enhancement helps to beautify the downtown area and create a more inviting atmosphere for residents and visitors.

Spring Concrete and Asphalt Restoration

Public Works crews are continuing restoration work in the area between Landwehr Road and Wester Avenue, and between Dundee Road and Walters Avenue (identified in the map). Crews have completed 19 total restorations, and the restorations in this area are expected to be completed by Friday, May 30.

Tree Stump Removal Restoration

Public Works has completed 17 of the 83 restoration sites where stumps were removed. Adjacent residents are asked to periodically water these restorations to help with the growth of grass which also helps to prevent the proliferation of weeds in restorations.

The Department of Planning Services Updates
