July 4th Celebrations

Celebrate the Fourth of July in Northbrook tomorrow with a full day of activities! Start the morning at 7:30 a.m. with the Liberty Loop 5K and Kids' Liberty Lap at Techny Prairie Park. In the afternoon, enjoy the Fourth of July Parade, starting near Westmoor School, with the Family Bike Parade kicking things off at 4 p.m. (register in advance or on-site). End the day with DJ entertainment at 7 p.m. at the Ed Rudolph Velodrome, followed by fireworks at dusk. The best views are from Meadow Hill Park and Techny Prairie Park.

- **LRS Service Holiday Delay:** If your refuse or recycling pickup is on Friday, your LRS pick-ups will be delayed one day due to the holiday.
- **Village Offices Closed:** All non-emergency Village offices will be closed on July 4.

Parade Road and Parking Restrictions: On the morning of Thursday, July 3, barrier fencing and barricades will be staged along the parade route. Full road closures along the parade route will go into effect at 2:30 p.m. on Friday, July 4, to ensure a safe and well-coordinated event for participants and attendees. Walking/Biking Path Repairs on Founders Drive – Rescheduled for Week of July 7

Asphalt repairs along the walking and biking path on Founders Drive, between Kamp Drive and Techny Road, have been rescheduled to begin the week of July 7 (weather permitting). Public Works crews will address uneven surfaces by first grinding down affected areas followed by the repaving of the designated areas with hot mix asphalt. This work is expected to take approximately one week to complete.


Northbrook Downtown Infrastructure Improvements and Streetscape Enhancements

The Village's contractor, Leonardo Construction has substantially completed the project with punch list items remaining including landscape pots, and tree grates.



Automated Water Meter Project

The Village of Northbrook has reached 37% of new meters being installed since work began on April 22. As of Tuesday July 1, 2025, a total of 4,812 installations had been completed. The areas where meters have been installed are identified on the map below.



During the week of July 7, 453 replacements have been scheduled. In total almost 6,369 of the 12,203-meter replacements have been installed or are currently scheduled to be replaced over the coming weeks. Postcards have been mailed to customers in portions of all Billing Zones. These postcards outline the necessary steps to schedule an appointment for their meter to be replaced. Meter replacements can be scheduled after a customer receives a postcard. Meter replacement appointments are scheduled in 2-hour windows but take approximately 30 minutes to complete. 
Shermer Road Corridor Improvements

This week, work on Shermer Road between Willow Road and Walters Avenue included removal of curb and gutter and pavement on northbound Shermer Road. This is in preparation for storm sewer work and the installation of underground conduit at the intersection of Shermer Road and Sherman Drive for street lighting and traffic signals. Hydrant Flushing 2025-26 Update

Public Works has completed 30% of its hydrant flushing program for the 2025–2026 cycle, having flushed 416 of the 1,331 hydrants included in this year's program. This year's focus is on the area west of Western Avenue, with crews progressing from the northern part of the Village toward the south, as illustrated on the progress map below.


Hydrant Flushing (2025-2026) Progress Map



Sanitary Sewer Cleaning

Public works has completed 90% of its sanitary sewer cleaning for the 2025-2026 cycle, having cleaned 88,845 feet of Village-owned sanitary sewer infrastructure. This year's focus is on the northwest portion of the Village, as illustrated on the map below.

820 Dundee Rd – Tree & Brush Clearance Work

As part of the Village's site preparation efforts for the future Fire Station 11, two (2) trees were removed this week along Dundee Road by the Village's tree removal contractor. These trees were near power lines, and for the safety of Village crews, it was necessary to utilize a specialized contractor trained and equipped to safely perform this type of work. This work is part of a larger tree and brush clearance effort at the 820 Dundee Road property in advance of demolition activities. Next week, Public Works crews will continue with additional tree and brush clearing along the property lines to allow a Village contractor to begin installing the demolition and construction fencing. These preparatory steps are essential to safely and efficiently begin demolition of the existing structure and initiate construction of the new Fire Station 11.

Northbrook Police Crisis Intervention Team Officers

The Police Department relies upon Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) officers who are specially trained to help those experiencing a mental or behavioral health crisis with safety, care, and

connection to resources. These Officers work closely with the Department's civilian employees in the Counseling Services Unit to ensure residents get the support they need. When individuals call the Northbrook Police Department, they can request a CIT officer. Commander Salmi and Officers Caliendo and Giarmidis recently attended the Illinois CIT Conference to continue strengthening this important service to the Northbrook community.

Staffing Update

The Village welcomes new Northbrook Police Officer James Hoppers, a later hire from the Memphis Police Department since 2019 where he was a Narcotics Detective and Drug Canine Handler.
