Updates

Preparations for Northbrook Days

Work in the West Community Parking Lot was started this week to accommodate the use of the lot for Northbrook Days. This week, Public Works removed parking stall signs from the south half of the west commuter lot and trimmed trees and bushes along sidewalks to maintain safe pedestrian access. On Friday, July 25, the remaining signs are being removed, and the lot will be swept. Next week, crews will deliver woodchips for Civic in the west lot, install "No Parking"

signs on nearby residential streets, and place message boards and traffic control equipment to support event operations and safety. The west portion of the Grainger lot (along Shermer) is now open for commuter parking.

820 Dundee Rd Scheduled for Demolition

Demolition of the existing structure at 820 Dundee is scheduled to begin the first week in August. The property is the future home of Fire Station 11.

Shermer Road Corridor Improvements

During the week of July 21, crews removed curb, gutter, pavement, and sidewalk along northbound Shermer Road to prepare for storm sewer and utility work. Underground conduit was also installed at Shermer's intersections with Techny and Willow for future lighting and signals. Next week, storm sewer prep will continue along with a planned water main shutdown on Tuesday, July 29, to relocate hydrants. A 72-hour notice will be provided to affected properties. Sidewalk removal on the east side of Shermer will also continue.

ComEd Work Vegetation Management Herbicide Treatment Notice

ComEd will conduct herbicide treatment along its transmission corridors near Skokie Boulevard and the Edens Spur beginning in August and continuing through October. This work is part of ComEd's ongoing vegetation management program to help prevent outages caused by trees and brush interfering with power lines. The treatment targets only low-growing brush and is applied by trained professionals under strict safety guidelines. Spraying is paused during windy or poor weather conditions to prevent drift and ensure public safety. ComEd has directly notified affected property owners with details about the work, dispute resolution options, and how to appeal through the Illinois Commerce Commission. 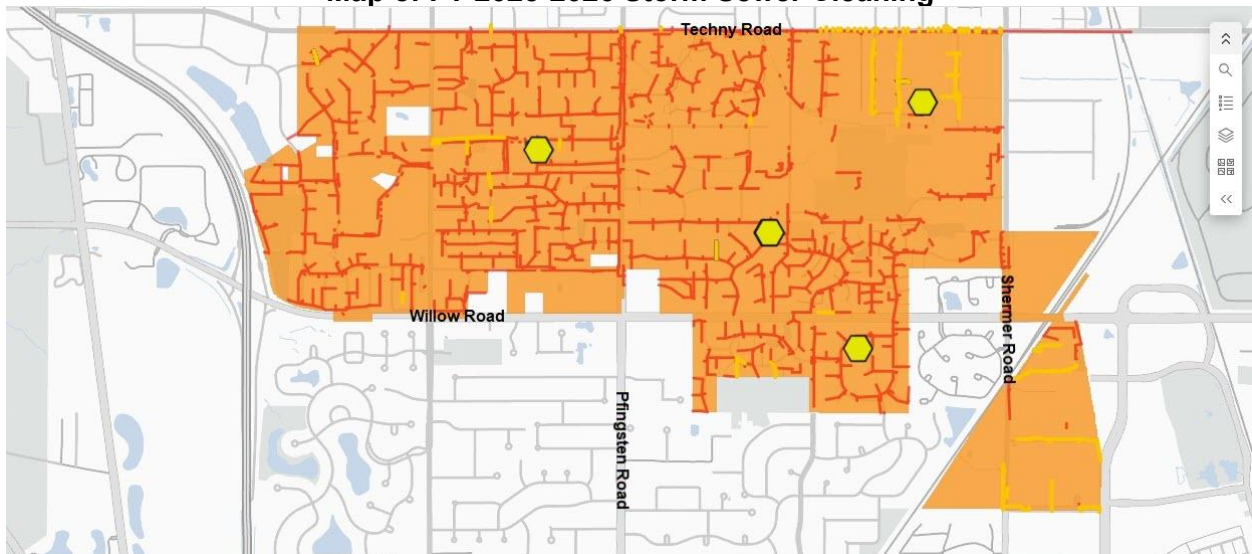
Sidewalk Grinding Completed for FY 2025–2026

Public Works has completed all 402 scheduled sidewalk grinding locations for Fiscal Year 2025–2026. This annual maintenance work improves walkability throughout the Village by reducing trip hazards.

Storm Sewer Flushing FY 2025-2026 Progress Update

As part of the Fiscal Year 2025–2026 maintenance program, Public Works crews have cleaned approximately 16,860 feet of the Village's storm sewer system, representing 9% of that infrastructure. Storm sewer flushing is a critical to maintaining infrastructure and helps to ensure proper drainage, reduce the risk of localized flooding, and prevent damage that can be caused by debris and sediment buildup. This process also protects local waterways by minimizing the flow of pollutants into the storm sewer system. Please refer to the map below for the completed flushing areas.

Nicor Gas Main Replacement Installation

Nicor completed asphalt roadway restoration on Shermer Road north of Meadow Road. Nicor will complete roadway striping next.

Automated Water Meter Project

The Village of Northbrook continues to move forward with the installation of new meters that began on April 22. As of Wednesday, July 23, 2025, a total of 6,122 installations had been completed.

Cook County Roadway Construction Projects

Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways continues resurfacing work for the three projects within the Village.

Project Locations and Updates:

- ***Landwehr Road (Hampton Court in Glenview to Dundee Road)***
 - Completed work for this location includes installation of inlet filters, sidewalk saw cuts, and silt fence installation.
 - Next week, the County anticipates continuing sidewalk construction, resurfacing work, permanent pavement markings, and electrical work.
- ***Sunset Ridge Road (Lake Avenue in Glenview to Skokie Boulevard)***
 - Completed work for this location includes installation of inlet filters, sidewalk saw cuts, silt fence installation, storm sewer work, and pavement milling.
 - Next week, the County anticipates continuing resurfacing work, permanent pavement markings, and electrical work.
- ***Walters Avenue (Landwehr Road to Pfingsten Road)***
 - Completed work for this location includes installation of inlet filters, sidewalk construction, silt fence installation, storm sewer work, and pavement milling.
 - Next week, the County anticipates continuing resurfacing work, permanent pavement markings, and electrical work.

2025 Local Drainage Improvements

The 2025 Local Drainage Improvements Project will begin in August. In advance of construction, the contractor will install erosion control, and complete utility locates. This year's improvement sites include Auburn Lane – Manor Drive, Helen Drive – Harbor Lane, as well as Dehne Road – between Butternut Lane and Penfold Place. Each location is expected to take about one week. These localized projects—separate from the Village's broader Stormwater Management Plan—address resident concerns by adding features like berms, storm sewer inlets, or piping to improve drainage.

Fourth Of July Traffic Safety Campaign

Northbrook joined more than 200 law enforcement agencies across Illinois in a high-visibility enforcement effort aimed at removing impaired drivers from the roads and promoting seat belt use. The campaign combined enforcement with public outreach and media efforts including "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over," "Drive High Get a DUI," and "Click It or Ticket." The Northbrook Police Department conducted 10 traffic stops during the recent Fourth of July traffic safety campaign, which ran from June 20 to July 7 which resulted in four speeding citations and two citations for Improper Lane Usage.
