Updates

NSMAD: Nile Virus risk level is increasing

According to the North Shore Mosquito Abatement District (NSMAD) the current West Nile Virus risk level is moderate and increasing quickly. The best way to protect yourself from [West Nile virus](#) is to prevent mosquito bites during West Nile virus season, which is typically the end of

May through early October. Individuals should take personal protection measures, like EPA registered repellent for adults – do not use repellent on babies younger than two months old. It is also important to eliminate stagnant water around property which will help reduce risk. Learn more from NSMAD [here](#).

Shermer Road Corridor Project – Planned Watermain Shutdown – August 5

As part of the Shermer Road Corridor Project, a watermain shutdown is scheduled near Brentwood and Shermer on Tuesday, August 5, starting at 9 a.m., to allow for hydrant relocation. Automated Water Meter Project

2025 Local Drainage Improvements

Construction for the 2025 Local Drainage Improvements Project is scheduled to begin on Monday, August 4. Work will begin on Dehne Road between Butternut Lane and Penfold Place, followed by the Intersection of Helen Drive and Harbor Lane, and lastly at the Intersection of Auburn Lane and Manor Drive. Each of these projects is expected to take approximately one week to complete.

ComEd Work Vegetation Management Herbicide Treatment Reminder

ComEd will be performing transmission herbicide treatment within the right of way in August and continue through the month of October. This ongoing maintenance program helps to ensure system reliability by reducing the risk of outages caused by vegetation interfering with power lines. Work will be done along the Skokie Boulevard corridor and the adjacent Edens Spur corridor. CMAP releases updated Community Data Snapshots

Northbrook annual Community Data Snapshot can be found [here](#). New this year, CMAP has:

- Data on uninsured populations
- Updated estimates of annual vehicle miles traveled per household
- County-level development data from CMAP's [Northeastern Illinois Development Database](#)

CMAP also has key data as part of the [online dashboard](#) for the region's seven counties — Cook, DuPage, Kane, Kendall, Lake, McHenry, and Will — 284 communities, and 77 Chicago

community areas. Most data comes from the American Community Survey (2019-2023), a sample-based data product. Additional Northbrook data can also be found on the Village [website](#) based upon the 2023 the National Community Survey™ (The NCS™) which focused on the livability in Northbrook and comparative resident perspectives gathered in surveys from over 500 communities nationwide. Survey questions were categorized into the 10 main “facets” of community livability including economy, mobility, community design, utilities, safety, natural environment, parks and recreation, health and wellness, education arts and culture, and inclusivity and engagement. The NRC's database includes benchmarks amongst all of the participating communities. Northbrook is scheduled to complete another survey this year as part of the upcoming Strategic Planning process.
