Updates

Back-to-School Safety: E-Bikes & Scooters, and Micromobility

With Glenbrook North back in session, and all other Northbrook Public Schools starting this coming week, the Northbrook Police Department is reminding families to brush up on important safety rules for E-Bikes, E-Scooters, and other micromobility devices. Read all about it [here](#).

Additionally, new local restrictions for the operation of E-Bikes, E-Scooters, and other micromobility devices on local streets and sidewalks will be recommended by the Police Department on August 26, 2025, as part of the Regular Meeting of the Village Board. To prepare for this, the Police Department held two public forums earlier in July to hear from residents regarding the topic. Additionally, staff has been researching regulations in surrounding communities as well as pending ordinance under review by our neighbors as well.

Shermer Road Corridor Improvements

With school in session at Glenbrook North High School and Maple School students returning this coming week, updates have been provided to schools for sharing with parents and students about the traffic impacts and lane closures on Shermer Road which continue this fall related to this major infrastructure improvement project. Everyone is reminded to plan ahead and allow extra time to get to GBN and Maple School. Drivers will always be able to access at least one lane of traffic, however, the outside lanes of Shermer Road are closed. The entrances to both schools will remain open to traffic. Additionally, the east sidewalk along Shermer Road will be closed to pedestrian traffic while a new sidepath is being constructed. Parents and students should use caution when traveling through the construction zone.

Sales Tax Monthly Report

The monthly sales tax data ([linked here](#)) for collections through May 2025 (distributed to Village in August 2025) came in at \$1,904,342 which is \$388,765, or 26%, greater compared to the monthly amount collected from August 2024. This sales tax amount includes the automatic 1% municipal tax, 1% home rule tax, and 3% local cannabis tax.

Building Permit Activity:

- Building permits have been issued for a proposed 2nd story addition and interior renovations to the *Charles Schwab* office building located at 445 Skokie Boulevard.
- Application has been received for interior alterations proposed for the future location of the *Great Escape* at 307 Skokie Boulevard.

Animal Rescue

Two coyote pups got a second chance thanks to the combined efforts of Northbrook's Police, Fire and Public Works staff. The pups, suffering from mange, were found sheltering in a concrete culvert. Mange is a skin disease caused by mites. Animal control safely captured and transported the pups to Flint Creek Wildlife Rehabilitation where both are settling in well while being treated under the care of a licensed rehabilitator.
