Zoning Code FAQ

Labor Day Safety Campaign

Northbrook Police Department successfully conducted an impaired driving enforcement effort over Labor Day weekend, resulting in 14 traffic stops with citations written for:

- 1- Suspended Registration Violation
- 1 - Operation of Uninsured Motor Vehicle
- 4 - Other Registration Violations

2 - Equipment violations

“Through the Labor Day safety campaign, we helped to make our roads safer and spread the word about the risks of impaired driving – ‘It’s Not a Game,’” said Community Relations Supervisor Richard Rash.

The Northbrook Police Department collaborated with other law enforcement agencies and highway safety partners across the state for the Illinois Labor Day “Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over” and “Drive High Get a DUI” campaign. This effort was part of the statewide “Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over,” “Drive High Get a DUI” and “Click It or Ticket” initiatives, funded by federal highway safety funds through the Illinois Department of Transportation.

Citizen’s Police Academy

Connecting residents with the Northbrook Police Department is an essential part of the 2025 Fall Citizen’s Police Academy which started this week and continues through the end of October. The Academy is fully booked and over the course of the nine week class, participants will learn a brief overview of the department’s communications center, our recruitment and field training program, the K9 program, traffic stops, the UAV program, defensive tactics, crisis intervention, crime scene investigations, and the investigations unit.

First Responder Appreciation

On August 4th Northbrook police officers and firefighters responded to the JCC for a victim who had a heart attack while swimming in the pool and was pulled from the pool by other swimmers and staff, but was not breathing. Officers arrived on scene and took over life saving efforts from staff until Northbrook Fire Department arrived on scene and continued life saving efforts while transporting the victim to Highland Park Hospital. On September 3 the victim and his wife provided lunch to members of the Police and Fire Departments that saved his life. The victim related that he had quadruple bypass surgery following the incident and is recovering at home thanks to the efforts from Northbrook’s first responders.
