Updates

Sales Tax Monthly Report

The monthly sales tax data for collections through July 2025, distributed to Village in October 2025, came in at \$1,869,807 which is \$498,566, or 36.4%, greater than the monthly amount collected in October 2024 (July 2024). This sales tax amount included the automatic 1% municipal, 1% home rule, and 3% local cannabis taxes. [View the full sales tax report here.](#)

Shermer Road Corridor Improvements

The Shermer Road construction work continues between Willow Road and Walters Avenue with a planned water main shutdown which is scheduled for Monday, October 13 at the intersection of Shermer Road and Oak Avenue to allow for fire hydrant relocations. Notices have been distributed to the twenty-three businesses and residents impacted by this temporary shutdown.

New asphalt paving of Shermer between Techny and Willow roads is underway and expected to be completed during the week of October 20. The contractor continues with both the installation of light pole foundations and underground conduit along northbound Shermer Road and the excavation and grading of the parkway on the east side of the roadway.

Concrete panel replacement on Shermer Road north of Techny is scheduled for November with substantial project completion is anticipated for December 2025.

In 2022, the Village was awarded \$3,504,200 in Surface Transportation Program (STP) grant funding for installation of a side path and roadway resurfacing of Shermer Road through the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning and a \$250,000 in Invest in Cook grant funding by County.

An important element of these improvements Shermer Road is the addition of a side path as part of the project which was envisioned as part of the [Master Bicycle and Pedestrian plan that can be read by clicking here](#) and is designed to make walking and bicycling, safer, more convenient, and more enjoyable for people of all ages and abilities. The Northbrook Master Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan serves as the Village's guiding policy and plan to achieve this vision of a bicycle- and walk-friendly community. The plan's vision and goals represent the Village's values and aspirations for bicycling and walking as both transportation and recreation choices. They are ambitious, yet achievable. Existing conditions for bicycling and walking, as well as previous planning efforts, are documented in the plan as a reference point for future investments in bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure and program investments.
